PASTOR'S PEN

In today's second reading, St. Paul highlights for us three important theological virtues, gifts from God, to help us remain true to the life and the teachings we have received; these virtues are Faith, Hope and Love. It is important for us to bring these virtues into our daily lives so we can draw strength from them in living our baptismal calling to be disciples of Jesus.

Faith

Faith is foundational to our living in right relationship because with faith we have come to see that there is One greater than ourselves who is our creator and who loves us unconditionally. Salvation history offers us many examples of how God remains faithful even in the face of our

sinfulness, always bringing us back into right relationship with Him.

In today's gospel, the Pharisees were trying to get rid of Jesus by discounting his word so that people would not put their faith in him. If Jesus had said it was lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar he would have been siding with the Roman occupation, thereby violating Jewish law. On the other hand, if he had said "don't pay your taxes," then he would have been arrested and seen as an insurgent. Jesus simply says give to Caesar what is Caesar's and give to God what is of God. This statement is not a strict separation between church and state. Rather, it recognizes that there are human laws, which find their foundation in God's law.



The second virtue St. Paul emphasizes is the call given to us in baptism to live in love, to reflect the face of Christ to others. What does it mean to live in love? St. Thomas Aquinas defines love in this way, "to will the good of the other and to act

upon it." Living in love takes work because this means we must sacrifice ourselves for the sake of another person. Another challenge to living in love is that we often use the word love to express a preference, saying, "I love your jacket or I love pizza." Love is not simply a preference. Rather, love is a virtue, a gift from God that is all about living in right relationship with God and one another, fulfilling God's dream for unity, that all be one.



Thirdly, because of the life, death and resurrection of Christ we live by hope. Sometimes the word hope is used interchangeably with optimism. But they are two different things. Optimism is an attitude that is easily affected by the ups and downs of life. Hope is a virtue, a gift by which we

recognize that everything comes from God and that God is leading all things to the good. This can be seen in today's first reading. The Prophet Isaiah spoke to the people of God who were exiled in Babylon. For 57 years they prayed, repented of their sins and returned to the Lord. In ways they least expected, God took the hand of Cyrus, King of Persia, who was a pagan and guided him to defeat the Babylonians. Once freed, Cyrus allowed the Israelites to return home to Jerusalem and he provided resources to rebuild the Temple. If God can use such an unsuspecting person, a pagan to bring about his Kingdom, it is a reminder to us that God will use any means to renew our hope.

Tapping into the gifts of faith, love and hope we have what we need to live healthy and spiritual lives. St. Gaspar, the founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood often encouraged the faithful to become saints. All that is needed for us to become saints has been given to us through the Holy Spirit. Let us become the saints God created us to be!
