PASTOR'S PEN

Today's parable continues the teaching of Jesus on the coming day of the Lord. I used to think, wow, those five wise virgins in Matthew's gospel were pretty selfish. After all, as children we are taught the importance of sharing. Shouldn't the five virgins with plenty of oil have helped the five who were in need? Since parables carry layers of meaning let's look at the story from another angle.

The point Jesus wants to make is that there are some things we cannot do for others. For example, let's say I'm going to eat lunch for you today so you don't have to waste time eating. Is that going to help satisfy your appetite? If I ask you to take a nap for me is that going to help me feel refreshed later in the day? No, there are some things we can't do for others.

So too, in the journey of faith, each person must make a commitment to follow the Lord. My spiritual preparations cannot take the place of your need to grow in your relationship with Jesus. We cannot transfer the good deeds we do to someone else. Each of us is responsible to use our God given time, talents and resources to build the Kingdom of God on earth; to bring the light of Christ into the world.

In today's parable we can look upon the lamp as the light of faith and the oil in the lamp as all the prayer, good deeds and expressions of faith we practice in our life. Like fuel for the fire our prayer, good deeds and expressions of faith bring light into the world and point the way to Christ.

To help guide us along the path of life God offers us the gift of wisdom, the gift of the Holy Spirit that helps us to see as God sees. Wisdom teaches us that life is not always going to be easy, but Jesus will help us carry our cross. Wisdom teaches us that we must be prudent in how we use our time, talent and treasure and never lose sight of the gift of salvation. Wisdom teaches us that God's covenant of love is everlasting and that we must do our part in living that covenant of love.

Today, may the witness of our faith be the oil that we store up in preparation for the second coming of the Lord. With wisdom as our guide we need not fear death or judgment because wisdom will enable us to be alert and prepared for the day when Christ will come to take us to himself. Striving to be united with Christ, we can live joyfully in the present and live in hope of the life to come. Remember, the only thing we take with us in death is the love we have stored in the lamp of our heart, a love fueled by prayer, works of mercy and our response to God's call in our lives.
