

PASTOR'S PEN

Each one of us has a unique contribution to make in building the Body of Christ. We have been born at this particular time and place in history, with our unique abilities and experiences to continue the mission of Jesus. The journey in faith is not so much about my personal goal of getting to heaven, but how many others I can bring with me along the way. This is how we return our gifts to God with increase.

In the time of Jesus, it was not unusual for a wealthy person to entrust his property to his servants. Slaves often held managerial positions and ran entire estates. There is something tragic about the man who allowed his life to be ruled by fear, hiding his master's money in the ground. It's sad that he chose to sit on the sidelines of life while the world passed him by. The risk of failure was too great for him and so, he allowed fear to determine what to do with this tremendous opportunity.

Has this happened to you—a time when it was easier to live in darkness rather than live and share the Light of Christ? Maybe you are at a stage in life where you feel you've done your fair share and the fear of getting involved has you standing along the sidelines of life. Maybe you are afraid of disappointment or failure and this paralyzes you from action. Maybe your priorities are out of balance and you are torn by the challenge of getting everything done. What rules your life—fear or faith?

It is true, not all of us have been given the same ability or the same talents. What matters is how we use what is given to us, to be good stewards of the gifts God has given to us. Burying these talents or keeping them to ourselves is not what God envisioned for us. As children of the Light we are to be watching, witnessing and working until the whole world is bright with the Light of Christ.

Like the virtuous wife in our reading from the Book of Proverbs or the two industrious servants in the gospel, we are asked to use our gifts and talents freely and openly. A few years ago, our bishops summed up the call to stewardship in this way: "To receive God's gifts gratefully, to cultivate God's gifts responsibly, to share God's gifts lovingly with others and to return God's gifts—with increase—to God. Stewardship demands that we believe and trust that whatever comes our way, God will be with us.

The mission of our parish community is to foster a community of love that works to continue the mission of Jesus. Each of us has been given riches beyond measure! As we celebrate Thanksgiving this week, be aware of the many gifts and blessings that you have received from God. These blessings and gifts are meant to be used to build the Kingdom of God on earth. Do not let fear keep you from sharing generously from your heart. God loves us deeply and unconditionally, we are called to love one another in the same way. When we give of ourselves we do not lose anything. Instead, we gain eternity. How will you invest your life and the resources God has entrusted to you?
