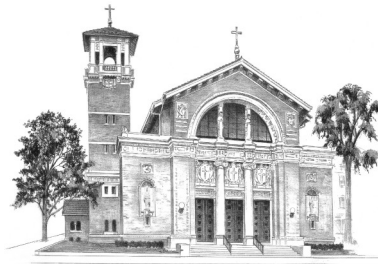

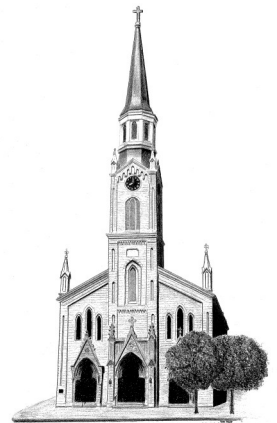

DEACON MATT'S PEN

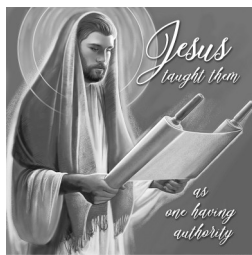
The people are astonished at Jesus' teaching. The people are astonished at Jesus for "He taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes" (Mark 1:22). What did Jesus say to the people? You see it is not uncommon to read about a teaching Jesus in the gospels. To read about a teaching Jesus is nothing new.

I mean there are several examples of a teaching Jesus like the Sermon on the Mount, the parable where the sheep get separated from the goats, or even the parable with seed falling on rich soil. I am sure you can add to the list of examples of different times Jesus taught people. What makes Jesus' teaching today different from these other three teaching examples? Well in these three teaching examples we learn about the content of Jesus' teaching message. For example in the Sermon on the Mount Jesus teaches that the poor in spirit are blessed, that we are to let our light shine so others can see, and the list of teachings goes on from this example.

In the teaching example in the separation of sheep and goats we learn that those who feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, and care for the sick and imprisoned not only care for their brothers and sisters in need but are also caring for the Lord. In the parable with seed, we read about seed falling on a path and the birds eating it, some fell on rocky ground and is scorched due to lack of roots, and the seed that falls on rich soil that produces a bountiful harvest.

What makes today's teaching different from the above mentioned teaching examples is that we are not told about the content of Jesus teaching. We only learn that Jesus astonished the crowd he "taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes" (Mark 1:22). Jesus astonished the crowd, what did Jesus say that had them astonished?

In last week's gospel Jesus began his public ministry by proclaiming "The Kingdom of God is at Hand" (Mk 1:15). Perhaps this was a part of Jesus' teaching message. Did Jesus teach in a way that the people understood what he was talking about? Perhaps also what left the crowd astounded was not so much about what Jesus said in his teaching. Spending over half of my life as a student, I have had all kinds of teachers and some were better than others. The teachers that I have been most astonished with are not necessarily the ones that were highly educated. Actually the teachers that I have been most astonished with were the ones that were patient and took time to help me understand the material they wanted me to learn. Often times this meant not only teaching material but also building a personal relationship with the teacher.



Perhaps what left the people most astounded was by the way Jesus used his authority in his teaching. Experience tells me the better teachers are the ones that practiced what they preached. Did Jesus put into practice what he preached? The best teachers in life are not necessarily the ones found in a school building and a classroom. I have found the best teachers

in life lead by example. How they lead their lives and what they do. All of us, by our baptism are teachers of what it means to be a follower of Christ and to be a Christian. By the way you live your life and what you do you show the world who Christ and a Christian is to our world. How will the actions of your life give positive light to our world?
