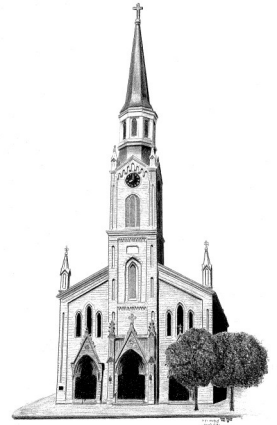

PASTOR'S PEN

Do you remember the story from the Book of Job? Job and his wife had 7 sons and 3 daughters. He owned a large estate which included over 7000 sheep, 3000 camels, 500 oxen and much more. Suddenly, his livestock is stolen, his children are swept away by a storm and he himself is stricken with a skin disease. For 36 long chapters Job tries to make sense out of his life, finally demanding an audience with God. Sometimes we feel a kinship to Job as we try to find meaning out of our suffering, illness or tragedies in life.

I recall a number of years ago when Tim and his wife Christine had experienced a "Job year." Their 16-year-old daughter Erin had died of Cystic Fibrosis and then six months after Erin's death Tim lost his job with the Department of Transportation. At one point in that year Tim said to me: "You know Father, they say God doesn't give you any more than you can handle, "Well, I'm at the edge." "But, what's weird is that I don't feel lost or alone. God has given me some incredible experiences of family and friends and I've had a lot of quiet time to think, which used to drive me nuts. But now I spend time talking to God and something inside me says it's going to be OK."

Like Tim, like Job, like the people in Mark's Gospel who came to Jesus to be healed, we see people whose days and nights have been filled with darkness and pain, worry and fear. All of us have experienced this at one time or another. Jesus is the one who can restore order to our lives returning life to the original blessing God intended for us.

- ◆ Like Simon's mother in law, Jesus takes us by the hand and helps us up through family, friends and caring people so that we can experience once again the dignity of being a child of God.
- ◆ In restoring order, Jesus brings healing into our lives through a variety of ways; sometimes it's physical healing, sometimes its spiritual, emotional, psychological or relational healing.
- ◆ Then Jesus shows us by example the need to go to the quiet and to pray. The call to go to the quiet and pray is not a weakness. It is essential for a balanced life.

In many ways, the space for silence and prayer is missing from our day to day lives. We need to make room for silence. Whether that be sitting on the edge of your bed before you go to sleep and naming one grace from the day or fasting from the computer or TV for 30 minutes to sit in the quiet or by offering a prayer as you wait in line, like Jesus, we need to pray. Notice that the quiet doesn't last long. It didn't take the disciples long to find Jesus. Yet, that quiet prayer is important because it gets us ready for whatever lies ahead, trusting in faith that God is with us. In a moment of quiet, bring to God a need or a concern that you hold in your heart today. Hear Jesus say to you, "Do not let your hearts be troubled, have faith in my Father—have faith in me."



In 1997, St. John Paul II instituted a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. In parishes, it is celebrated on the Sunday following the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. **On this World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life** we recognize and give thanks for those who have

consecrated their lives to God and the Church through the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Some join a religious congregation or a secular institute. Others remain single and make profession to God through the local bishop and are known as consecrated virgins. The consecrated life is one way that men and women live out their baptismal commitment as followers of Jesus.
