PASTOR'S PEN

In our gospel reading today, Jesus reaches out in an act of healing love and touches a person who was suffering and isolated because of leprosy. In the time of Jesus any skin ailment was considered dangerous because it was seen as contagious and so in the Book of Leviticus we see that anyone who was thought to have leprosy was told to "dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp." By touching the man with leprosy Jesus became ritually unclean and yet it was a necessary action to bring unity and communion back into the life of this person who was banned from the community because of leprosy.

Jewish law required that a person who became ritually unclean by touching a leper had to enter a period of purification before entering the synagogue. Some scripture scholars think this is why Jesus remained outside in deserted places after he touched the leper. He followed the purity laws, but none-the-less people kept coming to him from everywhere. They too longed for healing love, a new life, the unity that was possible because of Jesus.

Blessed Teresa of Calcutta worked with lepers throughout her years of ministry. She once said "We have drugs for people with diseases like leprosy. But these drugs do not treat the main problem, the disease of being unwanted." The disease of being unwanted is a terrible disease. We can continue the work of Jesus by reaching out to those among us who are considered "unclean," the person we avoid talking to, the family member we ignore or the person we shun because of race, creed or cultural practices.

This week we begin the season of Lent. Maybe you are already considering what you will give up this year as a Lenten sacrifice. As you discern, I invite you to consider how you might fulfill your desire for a clean heart this Lent by making a special effort to reach out your hand and to touch someone who is on the edges, someone who is isolated or ignored. Just as Jesus welcomes us to come to him for healing so too we can be an instrument of hope and healing, making this world a better place one healing touch at a time.

Lent Begins February 14th

On Wednesday we will begin the season of Lent, a journey that some call the Church's annual retreat. Individually and collectively we prepare our heart, mind and soul for the celebration of Easter by responding to the call to turn away from sin and believe the Good News. In this season of grace, we are invited to reevaluate our relationship with God and with one another. As a community of faith, we journey with the Elect who are preparing to be received into the church at the Easter Vigil. It is a time of reflection, penance and purification for all of us as we prepare to renew our baptismal promises at Easter.

Lenten Reminders of Fast and Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal.

The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97 and 1252). There are other ways of doing penance such as prayer, acts of self-denial, almsgiving and works of personal charity, making the way of the cross or praying the rosary, visiting the sick and shut-ins, giving up a favorite food,

drink, game or show, reading scripture or anything of a sacrificial nature that helps you recognize God as the center of your life and the need to care for God's people.
