Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Someone once asked: "What is the difference between a sinner and a saint? The answer — confession. On **Tuesday**, **February 27**, **2018** every parish in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati will open its doors from **7:00 to 9:00 p.m.** for prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also known as Penance or Confession.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (ccc) reminds us that, "Those who approach the Sacrament of Penance obtain pardon from God's mercy for the offense committed against him, and are, at the same time, reconciled with the Church which they have wounded by their sins and which by charity, by example, and by prayer labors for their conversion." (ccc. 1422) (Please see today's bulletin insert for a guide to the sacrament.)

"To have an understanding of the root of sin we turn to Adam and Eve in the third chapter of Genesis. Adam and Eve lived in a world created by God as pure gift. They are asked only one thing—not to eat the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. But Adam and Eve break this commandment out of distrust in God's generosity. They believe the serpent who tells them that God is holding back this fruit out of jealous selfishness, not wanting man and woman to share in his knowledge of good and evil. This original sin is one of pride, as Adam and Eve desire to have what is God's. They selfishly think that they know what is best for them. In light of their sin, Adam blames both God and Eve, since God created her who tricked him into eating the fruit. Eve blames the serpent. Neither confesses their own responsibility for choosing what is not good, for breaking God's single commandment to them. This single sin against God introduces disharmony into the world. The Sacrament of Penance gives us the chance to confront our own part in this ongoing disharmony and commit to setting things right again."

"A common objection to sacramental confession is, 'Why do I need the Church to forgive my sins, when I can talk directly to God?' This objection would make sense if we believed the Church was simply a group of people who share the same beliefs about Christ and engage in similar, often shared religious practices. Catholic belief about the nature of the Church contains another layer. We believe that the Church is a sacrament, that is, a visible sign and instrument of the mystery of Christ at work in the world. We believe that the Church 'both contains and communicates' grace, the saving presence of Christ. (ccc. 774) Because together we are this sacramental sign of Christ, when one sins, the harmony of the Church is disrupted and its effectiveness (ability to bring God's saving grace to the world) is weakened."

"As Catholics, we are required to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year. This is not only an obligation but also an act of love mediated through the words and actions of the sacrament as we meet Christ's mercy, the medicine for all our sins." The Church encourages us to partake of the benefits of this sacrament especially during Advent and Lent and before receiving other sacraments such as Confirmation, Marriage and Holy Orders." "Those who approach the sacrament of Penance obtain pardon from God's mercy for the offense committed against him, and are, at the same time, reconciled with the Church which they have wounded by

their sins and which by charity, by example, and by prayer labors for their conversion." (ccc.1422)

Has it been awhile since you celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Is there someone you love who has stopped coming to Mass or feels separated from the Church? Join the Lord in inviting him or her back to church. Bring them with you to enjoy the quiet and peace of people gathered in prayer on **February 27th** and if the time is right, following upon your good example, invite him or her to consider talking with a priest or receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our Region 7 Lenten Calendar also offers many other opportunities to celebrate the sacrament. Remember, the light is on for you!
