PASTOR'S PEN

With the longer daylight hours and warmer temperatures, we're beginning to see signs of people engaged in the work of springcleaning. Along the curbsides we can see stacks of branches, old furniture and bags of garbage indicating the preparations that are underway for the new growing season. It's amazing to see how much clutter and mess finds its way into our lives—both externally and internally.

In today's gospel we see Jesus passionately involved in the work of cleansing the temple. The money changing and the buying and selling of animals for sacrifice in the temple had become big business and Jesus could not ignore the change in focus. With all the marketing going on it was difficult to see and experience the presence of God in the temple and so Jesus does some serious house cleaning.

The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word for "Spring" and is a season that calls us to do some spring cleaning within our hearts, minds and souls. Lent is a time to drive out whatever distracts us from our commitment to the Lord and to restore our awareness of God's presence in every moment of our lives.

Just as the money changers cluttered and blocked the entrance of the temple, we must look at what things block the entrance of our hearts? Maybe it is an attitude of complacency or contentment that keeps us from being involved in the mission of Jesus. Maybe our hearts are cluttered with thoughts of unforgiveness, fear, jealousy, prejudice, selfishness, discouragement or depression. Maybe we have drifted from living the Law of God and find ourselves making excuses for sinful behavior.

A key word for today's gospel is...zeal. The word zeal comes from the Greek term "zelos" and it means to be hot or to begin to boil. The disciples could see that Jesus had reached the boiling point and expresses justifiable anger at the sinful behavior taking place in the temple. St. Augustine once said that the virtue of hope has two lovely daughters, anger and courage. "Anger, so that what must not be, will not be and courage so that what must be, will be." Anger has the power to stir us into action but because it is a powerful emotion we must be careful that it does not become abusive to others or to ourselves.

The Bible speaks of "the zeal of the Lord" to describe the kind of love God has for us. God wants our hearts, minds and souls to be purified and cleansed of all that keeps us from loving Him. Ask yourself, what kind of spring-cleaning needs to happen in my heart this Lenten season? Where is God calling me to be a person of zeal?

If we are honest, much of what we are zealous about in life centers on sporting events, hobbies, social media or the work that we do. Unfortunately, zeal may also show itself in harmful ways such as addictions, pornography, gossip or the need to control others. What about our zeal for Jesus; He who zealously gave his life for us on the cross? Would our zeal be more characterized as lukewarm, cold or even frozen? If so, it's time to let Jesus drive out the unclean parts of our life.

There are those in our parish communities who are "on fire" with the Lord as they intensely prepare to be received into the Catholic church at the Easter Vigil this year. Please keep the following people in prayer as they enter the final weeks of their preparation to receive the Lord. May their faith inspire us to do the spring cleaning we need to do this Lenten season so we can renew our Baptismal promises at Easter with the zeal that marked the heart of Jesus.

Lenten Pilgrimage-Rwanda

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) have been in Rwanda since before 1960. CRS works with the Catholic Church and other partners through an integrated approach combining agriculture, nutrition and economic strengthening to help vulnerable people improve the quality of their lives. Programs focus on trauma healing, peace and justice values, and conflict management and transformation in the community to address the consequences of the 1994 genocide. Since 1996, Dayton has the largest Rwandan Community in the USA. After the massacre of their people, they immigrated with the help of several local resources. They successfully adapted and became part of our community. Many belong to Emmanuel's Faith Community, including the Rwandan Choir.
