PASTOR'S PEN

Several years ago while on retreat I met a lady named Dixie who told me about a game her young grandson Hugh came up with one wintery day. Hugh said, "Grandma, I love you bigger than New York City." In response, Dixie said: Hughie, I love you more than the state of New York and New Jersey together!" And Hugh responded, Grandma I love you bigger than the whole United States. And they would go on and on trying to describe how much their love was for the other ending with Hugh being able to say the names of all the planets and the universe combined! Dixie says, the game always stops there with Hugh as the winner. In his innocence, Hugh was trying to describe what unconditional love is all about.

God says to us today, "I love you unconditionally." Lifted high on the cross we see Jesus reaching out his arms and embracing the world, drawing all people to himself. The cross, an instrument of death, becomes the sign of life. This is our cause for rejoicing on this Laetare Sunday. All three readings this weekend focus upon the unconditional love and mercy of God.

In our reading from Second Chronicles we learned that even though the people of God had walked away from His covenant of Love and through their sinfulness found themselves in exile, God never gave up on His people, but kept reaching out to them in love and mercy. Death and destruction was not to be the last word. Rather, God uses the darkness of the Babylonian exile as a backdrop to the bright promise of new life! In a most unsuspecting way, God uses a pagan, Cyrus, King of Persia to conquer the Babylonians and inspires King Cyrus to allow the people of God to return home and to build a house of God in Jerusalem.

St. Paul says clearly in the second reading that "God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ." In order to enter more fully into the depth of God's love for us in this scripture passage it is helpful to note that one of the translations for the word mercy comes from the Hebrew word for womb. This insight draws us to think about the image from the Prophet Isaiah: "Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child within her womb? Even should she forget, God says, I will never forget you." (*Is 49:15*)

Our Gospel reading today includes one of the most famous passages of scripture, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16) This quote is situated in the context of an Old Testament story in which Moses is ordered to make a bronze serpent and put it on a pole as a remedy for the Israelites who had rebelled and sinned against God even though God had rescued them from slavery. Those who looked upon the bronze serpent were healed. This image became a symbol of Jesus on the Cross. From the cross of Christ, we see how much God loves us, redeeming us through his Precious Blood.

On this Laetare Sunday, we are over halfway through our Lenten journey and we hear the call to rejoice! The cause of our joy is God's great love for us. If you have not experienced the sacrament of reconciliation yet this Lent, I encourage you to do so! There is healing that comes from speaking to another person the wrong we have done and to hear the amazing words of absolution from God through the priest. If there are areas in which you have failed to keep your Lenten promise, humbly restart your journey so that in choosing to live in God's Light you can celebrate fully your unique identity as a child of God at Easter.

Pilgrimage—Kisasa Ward, Dodoma Region, Tanzania

The Village of Hope began in 2002 by the Sisters Adorers of the Blood of Christ, United States Province, in response to the plague of AIDS in Tanzania. The village is situated in one of the poorest regions of the country. Missionary work is aimed at treatment of HIV positive patients and prevention of the spread of the disease, especially among children. HIV orphans are often ostracized and abandoned. The village is home for them: they live in family style houses with Tanzanian parenteducators. Children have a sense of home and the love of parents and family. The project includes child care, education, clinic, laboratory, dispensary, and lodging for pregnant women to enable safe birth and needed treatment. St. Gaspar Hotel and Conference Center at the Village, under the Society of Precious Blood, opened in 2007.
