PASTOR'S PEN

If I were to ask you "What time is it?" you would likely check your watch or cell phone and tell me the hour. Much of our lives are regulated by time—meal time, appointments, schedules and bedtime. Today, Jesus says that "his hour has come." In John's gospel, the word hour is significant. Early in his gospel, at the wedding Feast of Cana, Mary is concerned that the host has run out of wine. Jesus says, "Woman, how does this concern of yours involve me? My hour has not yet come." During the next ten chapters, Jesus will work signs and miracles to reveal the Father's glory saying, "the hour is coming, when you will worship in spirit and truth, the hour is coming when the dead shall hear the voice of God" (5:25).

In today's reading Jesus proclaims that the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." (12:23) With today's reading, John's gospel moves from the Book of Signs to the Book of Glory. What does this glory entail? Many believed the Messiah would over-throw the Roman occupation and restore power to the Jewish people. But, Jesus has been preparing his disciples for a different kind of glory. In this hour of glory, he says, "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies, it produces much fruit." This image that Jesus uses speaks of the journey that Jesus will take along the way of the cross.

Like the seed that falls to the ground and dies, Jesus will give his life for the salvation of the world. His self-sacrifice is the fulfillment of God's covenant of love. When we contemplate the way of the cross we learn what it means for a seed to fall to the ground and die. During this season of Lent, God who shares our sufferings, wants to transform our hardened hearts, to break open our hearts so that we can live more authentic lives.

Jesus shows us that the way of the cross is the path of true love. In this journey we die to self and live for God alone. If you haven't prayed the stations of the cross this Lent I encourage you to do so. Walk with Jesus as he is unjustly condemned and feel the weight of the cross he carries. Ponder the courage it takes to get back up after falling not once, not twice, but three times. Learn from Jesus how to let others help you like Simon of Cyrene or Veronica. Hear Jesus speak to the women of Jerusalem and his own mother. Finally, being stripped of all worldly things, our final offering to God is the gift of self. This is what it means to live in glory, to offer our lives to the Lord and to one another as an act of unconditional love.

To help us live this covenant of love Jeremiah reminds us that God has placed his law within our hearts. Through these laws God is shaping us into the original vision he had for all humanity. As you internalize these rules, they become a part of you and shape your choices and way of life.

Jesus is for us the law of God made flesh and the fulfillment of the law. As he gives himself to us in the Eucharist we are becoming more and more like Him. The law of God is no longer just some words on a page in the bible, it is within us through the life we share in Christ. The challenge for us is to put into practice what we have learned from Jesus along the way of the cross. Like a grain of wheat, we must die to self and live in Christ.

Today, like the psalmist, we pray for a clean heart so that we can sort out what is truly of God in our lives and receive the grace to live the covenant of love God has placed in our hearts. What time is it? It is time for each of us to return to the Lord with all our heart to live his law of love.
