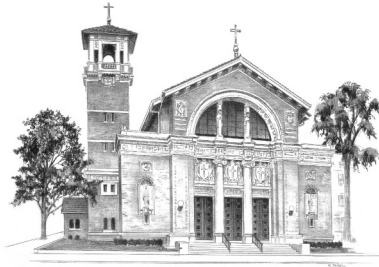

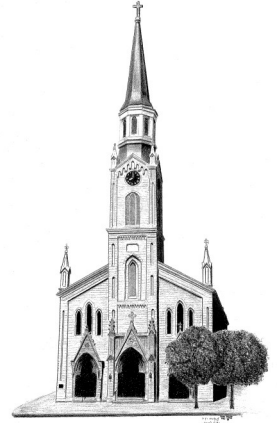

PASTOR'S PEN

Growing up outside of Wapakoneta my family raised sheep and one of the things I remember about sheep is that they could easily get into trouble if left by themselves. No matter what the danger, if they wanted something they went after it. Sometimes we are like sheep. We go after things that are not healthy for us and soon we find ourselves in trouble, vulnerable to attack by opponents like loneliness, addictions, selfishness, pride or envy. Like sheep, we need a shepherd to guide us because we often make mistakes and wonder off the right path.

Jesus the Good Shepherd knows each of us as his very own and speaks to us the truth that we are children of God. In this Easter season we celebrate the life we share in the Risen Lord. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who laid down his life for us. He asks us to trust in him, to learn from him and to follow his example as we hear the call to care for one another.



Reflecting upon the image of the Good Shepherd, Jesus wants us to realize that each of us has been given a flock to care for; each of us has a flock to lead and feed, to guide and protect. We have a family flock, a friend flock, a worship flock and maybe a work flock. Each of us has the responsibility and the privilege of looking after and caring for someone else.

We have the choice of either being a bad shepherd who runs away from responsibility, who is distracted by selfishness, showing no concern for others. Or, we can choose to be good shepherds who do whatever we can to know and love those who are entrusted to our care.

On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, we are encouraged to reflect upon the call we have received from the Lord. In baptism we become children of God and we all receive the same vocation, the call to holiness; to live as Jesus lived, to follow his example and to walk in his ways. Some live out their call to holiness in the vocation of marriage, others through the single life and some will respond to the call to holiness through a vocation as a priest, sister, brother, deacon or consecrated virgin.

I don't believe God has stopped calling people to ministry within the church; it's just that we're so easily distracted by the many voices crying out for our attention. Parents and Grandparents, it's important that you encourage your children to think of religious life as a possible vocational choice so that the church will have faithful leadership for the future.

Jesus has shown us that he will never abandon us. Even if we find ourselves in the dark valley, we need not fear because he is at our side with rod and staff that give us courage. Other times Jesus leads us along the path to peace, nourishing us with his body and blood, guided by His living word and supporting us by our community of faith.

As Jesus poured out his life-blood, He sealed God's covenant of love and formed a covenant that promises a future full of hope. Take some time today to listen for the voice of Jesus and allow him to lead you along the path to true and lasting peace.
