PASTOR'S PEN

When I say "9/11" I can imagine all sorts of memories come to the surface of your mind related to your experiences of that fateful day. It is something that is forever tied to our communal memory as a country.

In today's gospel reading Jesus draws upon an ancient symbol of the "vine" to grab the attention of his disciples. In the communal memory of the people of Israel, the vine was a symbol that represented them, the people, as the vineyard of the Lord. In today's reading, Jesus is giving this symbol a new meaning by identifying himself as the true vine. Israel was imperfect and continually failed to live in right relationship with God. Jesus has come to give us the perfect example of what it means to be human and to live in right relationship with the Father. It is no longer enough to simply be the chosen people of God, we must now belong to Christ and live in Christ.



Through the waters of baptism, we are grafted onto Jesus the true vine. Jesus emphasized the richness of this special relationship by saying he is the vine and we are the branches. We don't just stand beside Jesus or find ourselves associated with him; we now live IN him and the only way we can bear fruit is to remain IN him. It is essential that we remain in him because apart from him we can do nothing.

When we live in total union with Jesus, we can trust that our lives will bear much fruit. This means that the love we share is to be the same love that Jesus shares with the Father. Just as Jesus was obedient to the Father and lived in His love, so too we are to be obedient to Jesus; to love others not only in word or speech but more importantly in deed and truth.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we learn that Saul has been pruned of his mission to destroy the followers of Christ. God cleansed him of his misguided thinking and now Saul, soon to be named Paul, is ready to join the disciples in their mission to proclaim the Good News of the Risen Lord. But, the disciples were afraid of him because of his past behavior. Barnabas affirms that Saul is a new man. It's a reminder to us, "Do we see people as simply products of their past or do we leave room for God to transform a person's heart? Sometimes our old attitudes need to be trimmed clean

In the gospel when Jesus says, "I am the true vine" he is once again reaching back to another Old Testament memory when God spoke to Moses from the burning bush and identified himself as "I Am." Jesus gives new meaning to this image by saying, "I am the bread of life, I am the resurrection and the life, I am living water, or I am the Good Shepherd." The revelation of Jesus as "I Am" means he is speaking in the same way God speaks, that he is in union with the Father. The same God who freed the Israelites from slavery is now with them in Jesus who will free all people from sin and death.

In this Easter season we are asked to appreciate in a deeper way the union we have with Jesus; he who is the great "I Am" is the vine from which we have life. Apart from him we can do nothing. The cleaning and pruning that went on during the season of Lent must continue so that we remain in Jesus. Our call is to live in such a way that others can see Christ living in us. Throughout this week keep in mind the simple message of Jesus, "Remain in me."

The Congo, geographically the biggest country in Africa, was a Belgian Colony until 1960 when it received its independence. It is potentially one of the richest countries on earth, but colonialism, slavery and corruption have turned it into one of the poorest. The Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood established communities in the interior Province of Equateur. They dedicated themselves to the education of women and pastoral work. At present, they have two communities, Bamanya and Kinshasa. They serve in various apostolates, including education, health care, pastoral and social ministries.


