#### **PASTOR'S PEN**

A word that is repeated often in our readings today is the word LOVE. It's one of those words that has lost some of its power and strength in our current culture. Many times, people use the word love to speak about a preference they have for one thing over another, like when someone says, I love baseball, or I love that outfit you are wearing.

The kind of love that Jesus is speaking about is not a bumper sticker kind of love, but a love that is given unconditionally, a love that finds its origin in God. As St. John says, "we should love one another because love is of God." "Whoever is without love does not know God for God is love." (1 Jn 4:7,8)

The gift of love that God shares with us is many times misunderstood as something we must earn. Some believe that if we keep working hard, then God will eventually count-up all our good deeds like bonus points at Speedway and we can cash them in for our ticket to heaven. This is not what the love of God is all about. St. John remind us: Love consists in this, "Not that we have loved God, but that God has first loved us." (1 Jn 4:10) God's love is a gift freely given. It is not a reward we earn for good behavior.

So why do we go about doing good deeds and following God's Commandments? Think for a moment, what was the first lesson your mother taught you about receiving a gift...say: "Thank You!" The good we do, the commandments we keep are our thanks to God for the gift of His love. How often I've heard a Mom say: "the best gift that you can give me is to be good—to do what you're supposed to do!" That's the best thanks we can give to God for His love. We do this by treating all people with dignity and respect, visiting the homebound, forgiving those who have hurt us and sacrificing our desires for someone else's needs. The kind of love Jesus is challenging us to share is a love that is sacrificial, even to the point of giving up one's life for one's friend.

I recall a story from the life of Queen Victoria's daughter, Alice. Princess Alice had a four-year-old son whom she loved very much. One day the boy got sick and was soon found to have a highly contagious disease called Black Diphtheria. The nurses continually warned Alice to stay away from her son. Naturally this would be difficult for any mother.

One day as Princess Alice stood in the far corner of her son's room; she heard her son whisper to the nurse: "Why doesn't my mother kiss me anymore?" Well, this was more than Princess Alice could bear. As tears rolled down her cheeks she ran over to her son and she kissed him tenderly and held him very tightly, reassuring him of her love. Tragically, this kiss was deadly because Princess Alice soon contracted the disease and within a few weeks both mother and son were buried.

A parent understands deeply why Alice did what she did. When you truly love someone, no sacrifice is too great! This is what God has taught us through Jesus. This is the radical kind of love that each of us is called to live. Not a watered-down love, like someone who talks about loving baseball, but a love that is willing to die for another person, like the love of Jesus.

In the Eucharist we celebrate God's gift of love as we share in the body and blood of Jesus Christ. This gift of his sacrificial love frees us from the darkness of sin and death and provides us with the perfect model of how we are to love one another. When we live in His love then our joy will be complete. May we bear fruit by loving one another.

#### Mission— Cameroon

Being a Missionary in Cameroon By Rev. Fr. Emmanuel Fale

The task of evangelization in Cameroon is tedious due to many reasons. The terrain is difficult because of the poor road network. In the villages (mostly without water, electricity, health care etc), 75% of movement is done on foot (walking) and crossing rivers on what is generally called the Monkey Bridge. In addition, the people are poor, most are uneducated, and there is a language barrier when one meets uneducated audiences. Cameroon has over 250 native dialects.

The challenges are numerous, and so one has to think of the best way of bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ to a hungry people, to sick people who lack the necessary facilities for health care, to an uneducated population who may not understand the language you are using, nor the concepts used.

In the terms of the Desiderata: "Go placidly amid the noise and haste. And remember what peace there may be in silence. As far as possible without surrender, be on good terms with all persons," we try to reach out to everyone irrespective of religion or Christian denomination. With transparency and doctrine, we think we are reaching out to people in a Catholic way.

Reflection: Let us throw off the chains that prevent us from following Him. P.131
