PASTOR'S PEN

As we celebrate Mother's Day this weekend, I got to thinking about the kind of advice that Mom's give to their children to help them grow into adulthood. Maybe you remember hearing some of these phrases as a child.

- "If you keep making that face it will stay that way."
- "You don't need to have everything your friends have."
- "If you want to act like a child, I'll treat you like one."
- "If you can't say something nice about a person, don't say anything at all."
- "One day you'll thank me."
- "Because I said so that's why!"
- "When you have kids, I hope they're just like you."

After the resurrection, Jesus was helping the disciples develop a more mature life of faith. They struggled to recognize the Risen Lord and the mission they were called to continue in his name. Now that Jesus has defeated death, they think, surely this is how he will defeat the Roman occupation and restore Israel to its place of power. Once again Jesus stretches the disciples to look beyond their limited view. He has come to save all people, not just the people of Israel. The disciples are to be his witnesses not only in Jerusalem, but "throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Bishop Robert Baron notes that the disciples wrestled to understand what kind of impact the resurrected Lord would have upon their lives. "One way of looking at this new reality of a glorified existence is to imagine a square that becomes a cube, a circle that becomes a sphere, a triangle that becomes a pyramid. Christian hope is rooted in the resurrection of the body, the transformation of the whole body from a limited state to a glorified state. The ascension of the Lord gives us a clue that someday Christ will give us bodies like Christ's glorified body, an entirely new realm of existence."

When will this happen? Jesus does not tell us. He says, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority." (Acts 1:7) What he does tell us is that this new reality will be accomplished through the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus will gather the world to himself through the life of the Church.

We are to proclaim the Truth that there is "one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." The advice we are given is to "live in a manner worthy of our calling with all humility, patience...bearing with one another through love." (*Eph. 4*) This is something that can't wait. Like the early disciples we hear the call, "Don't just stand there looking at the sky, there's work to be done. Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature."

It is this same commission that we are given at the end of each Mass. After encountering the Living Christ in the Eucharist, we are given the instruction, "Go forth, the Mass is ended." In other words, don't just stand there, go out and bring Christ to that part of the world that you have been entrusted to care for as a missionary of Christ. Through the Holy Spirit each of us has been given a mission and we can trust that the Holy Spirit will equip us with all we need to be effective in this mission.

The Feast of the Ascension offers us the beautiful image of the Lord ascending from this life to take his seat at the right hand of God where he continues the work he began on earth. We are not left alone. Christ is guiding and directing the Church through the gifts of the Holy Spirit. What advice does Jesus give to us? "Don't just stand there admiring me...get to work!"

Mission — Bissau, Guinea-Bissau

One of five African countries colonized by Portugal, Guinea-Bissau suffers language isolation, political instability and extreme poverty. The CPPS Iberian Province continues
St. Gaspar's ministry of the Word by preaching renewal and conversion through missions and retreats. They minister in parishes, schools, hospitals and prisons. The Province of Tanzania collaborates with the Iberian Province in the small community in Guinea Bissau. They work with the Precious Blood seminarians in the formation ministry, where there are currently six seminarians at the Major Seminary in Bissau. Fr. Florentino was recently ordained. This was the second ordination of a Missionary of the Precious Blood from Guinea-Bissau.
