PASTOR'S PEN

One day a hitchhiker was trying to get a ride in Los Angeles. A car pulled over to pick him up. When the hitchhiker got into the car he saw the face of the driver and was shocked to see that it was film star Michael Douglas! All the hitchhiker could say was "Do you know who you are?" This is a great question for us to talk about as we celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity. "Do you know who you are?"

St. Paul reminds us in his Letter to the Romans that we "did not receive a spirit of slavery, but a Spirit of adoption." It's important to remember that the Greek and Roman empire of Paul's time was based on an economy of slavery. So, for Paul to say that the people are children of God rather than slaves...it was certainly Good News! And because we are children of God we are heirs of God, sharing in the relationship of love that is found between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

If you truly come to believe you are a child of God, it will change your life. On the other hand, if you do not know who you are you are more likely to take on a false identity and drift away from God.

In our First Reading, Moses was concerned that God's chosen people would forget who they were when they entered the promise land. The Canaanite people had many god's, but the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob was one God who had taken special interest in this rag-tag group of slaves from Egypt and brought them safely through the desert to the promise land. By following the one, true God they would find life, happiness and peace.

This is an important message for us to hear today; we are confronted and tempted with many voices competing for our attention, voices which say our identity is found in our work or social status, the things we have, or our accomplishments. Yet, St. Paul reminds us that our identity is to be found in the fact that we are children of God...sons and daughters of God! When we do not embrace this identity as children of God we go looking for love in all the wrong places and will find ourselves enslaved by one kind of sin or another, trying to fill the hole in the soul.

The life of the Holy Trinity reflects a relationship of love between the three persons of the Trinity. Since God is revealed to us in a relationship of love, we in turn are invited to enter this relationship of love and to reflect it in our day to day living.

To help us remember this truth, Jesus has given us the Eucharist, his Body and Blood as a constant reminder of who we are as children of God. He wants us to know how near he is to us in giving himself to us as food to strengthen us on our journey to our true and lasting home in heaven.

Matthew ends his gospel by telling us that the disciples worshiped Jesus, but they doubted. That little line, "but they doubted" gives me hope and encouragement in my response to the commission of Jesus. He does not expect us to have everything together before we go out and tell others about the faith. We do our best trusting in his promise, "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age through the power and gifts of the Holy Spirit."

"Do you know who you are?" Claim your identity as a child of God, let this gift fill every part of your being and know that whatever we offer in the name of the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit...we can be assured that God is with us!
