PASTOR'S PEN

In today's first reading from the Book of Genesis, we hear the very first question God asks humanity, "Where are you?" Adam and Eve had eaten from the tree that they were forbidden to eat and in their nakedness they hid from God. This question is a very important spiritual question, one that we should ask ourselves each day. Where are you in your relationship with God, with family, at work, in your community? Where are you in relation to your vocation in life, the person you are called to be? Where are you in relation to the needs of those around you? Where are you?

This is an important question because as Jesus reminds us, "A divided house will not stand." We are called to trust God in all things and yet, all too often we have a divided heart that tries to fix things all by ourselves. If we do not give ourselves entirely to God and follow His commands, then our house will be divided, and we will fall into sin and darkness.

In today's gospel, Jesus is being accused of driving out demons because he is possessed by Beelzebul, a fallen angel whose name means "lord of the flies." Beelzebul was second only to Lucifer when speaking about fallen angels. Jesus has been healing people, casting out demons, preaching the Good News of the Father's love. For those who knew him best, this was all very confusing. He grew up in their midst. He was the carpenter's son. How can he have all these powers?

We have a divided house when we forget to keep Christ at the center of our lives.

The only answer the people can give is that Jesus is out of his mind and that it is time for his family to come and take charge of him. If he thinks he is the Messiah, the Christ, then he really has gone crazy. Jesus responds to the people using a parable, "Can a house divided against itself continue to stand?" Consider what he has done thus far in his ministry. The message he has preached is that "The Kingdom of God is at hand." He invited some fishermen to join him as his disciples. He cured Simon's mother-in-law and healed a man with an unclean spirit. He ate with sinners and tax collectors. He allowed his disciples to pick grain on the sabbath. Are these the actions of a crazy person?

In the time of Jesus, the family was a very important aspect of life. To be separated from family was a very serious matter. When the family of Jesus arrives on the scene it is presumed that they will take care of him. At first it may appear that Jesus is rejecting his family by asking, "Who is my mother or who are my brothers?" Rather than rejecting his family Jesus broadens the circle of those considered to be his family. "Those who do the will of God are my mother, and my sister, and my brothers." Jesus is trying to bring us back to the original dream that God had for us at the beginning of time.

We have a divided house when we forget to keep Christ at the center of our lives. The challenge we face is that we easily pick up and take on the dominant values of the current culture which emphasizes consumerism, personal gain and a general disrespect for life and the dignity of each person. The battle that is going on is for the human heart. Do we choose to belong to the kingdom of the earth or the Kingdom of God? Our greatest unity is found in the person of Jesus Christ. When we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, the lessons that he taught us and the eternal life that he promises, then we will be at peace even in the midst of the storms that come our way in life.
