PASTOR'S PEN

The ritual for the baptism of a child begins with a question addressed to the parents: "What name have you given to your child?" In faith we believe that God knows each of us by name and calls us by name to respond generously to the vocation that he has given us.

In our Gospel reading today, the family and neighbors of Zechariah and Elizabeth are shocked that the new parents who waited so long to have a child, are not going to stay with tradition and name their child after one of their relatives. Their reaction was so strong you get the impression the parents were calling their child Spock or Igor.

If you recall, Zechariah had a vision while praying in the sanctuary of the Lord. The angel gives him the good news that he and Elizabeth will have a child and they are to name him John, a name which means "God is gracious." Because Zechariah doubted, he was made mute, unable to speak, until the day set aside for the naming of the child. That period of silence became a period of preparation and reflection.

For the relatives of John, their dream for this new child was limited by his family background. But God's dream for John was far beyond what anyone could imagine. This is true for each of us. God's dream for us exceeds whatever we could imagine. This is exciting because there is always something more that we can learn about ourselves and the call that God has placed within our heart.

Through baptism we have been anointed priest, prophet and king. Today's feast reminds us particularly of our baptismal vocation to be a prophet, to prepare the way of the Lord. The Lord says to us what He said to the prophet Jeremiah, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you. To whomever I send you, you shall go." Like the Prophet Isaiah we can say, "The Lord called me from birth, from my mother's womb God gave me my name."

This would be a wonderful feast to find out what your name means. The name Angelo means, heavenly messenger. Jeremiah means, the Lord exults. Joseph means, God will increase. Mary means, loved by the Lord. Zechariah means, remembered by God. Elizabeth means, God is my oath. Our names can give us a hint into the call we have been given in life.

The Birth of John the Baptist is significant because it signals the beginning of a new relationship that God will have with His people. St. Augustine used the analogy that John was the hinge between the Old Testament and the New Testament. The hinge of a door makes passage possible. On one side of the door of scripture we find the Law and the Prophets of Jewish history and tradition. On the other side of the door is Jesus who is the way, the truth and the life. On one side of the door we have two elderly people who have been baron for many years and are now expecting a child while on the other side of the door we have a young virgin who gives birth to a son and she names him Jesus.

In the northern hemisphere the placement of this feast of the birth of John is very symbolic. John was born six months before Jesus who is the true light of the world. At Christmastime, during the winter solstice we celebrate the rising sun, Jesus who brings light to the world. In the summer solstice when we celebrate John's birth, the light begins to decrease so that Jesus may increase.

The feast of the Nativity of John the Baptist celebrates the faithfulness of God from one generation to the next; God who prepares the way for us and has given us the gift of salvation. Like John we must

prepare the way for the Lord so that he may be made known in our world today. Taking our cue from John who went out into the desert, it is good to spend time in silence before launching into action. When we clear away the clutter in our lives we will hear more clearly God's voice and the prophetic role we have been given.
