#### **PASTOR'S PEN**

**Feast of the Precious Blood**—This weekend the parishes in Region 7 will be celebrating the Feast of the Precious Blood of Christ with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. July 1st is the traditional Feast Day for the Precious Blood Congregation and we are given permission to celebrate this Solemnity in the various ministerial sites where our members are assigned. The scripture readings and prayers for Mass will come from those assigned to the Feast of the Precious Blood.

The Precious Blood of Jesus reveals the covenant of love that is shared between God and God's people, a covenant that is unconditional and eternal. In the Bible, covenants express what it means to be in relationship with God and one another; it is our way of standing together. In the first reading from the Book of Exodus we recall the covenant God made with His people. After agreeing to follow the ten commandments Moses sprinkled the people with the blood of the sacrifice, a symbol of life, signifying their commitment to live the covenant, to be one with God.

In the Gospel, the blood of life is given new meaning as Jesus initiates a new covenant sealed in his blood. This new covenant was not seen as simply a "renewal" or "extension" of the covenants of old; it was something completely new. To highlight this new age, Jesus makes a bold statement at the last supper meal, telling the disciples—to drink his blood. The drinking of blood was something forbidden by Jewish law because blood was sacred to God alone. In giving us his blood Jesus is saying that the blood that belongs to God is now given to the community of believers who follow Jesus. The very life-force of God is given to us, binding us together as one.

In this new covenant Jesus is offering his own blood in place of the blood of sacrificial animals. The cup he offers contains his blood shed for us. By this action Jesus' life is not being taken from him, he gives it freely to us as an act of sacrificial love. It is this sacrifice which ushers in the new and eternal covenant for the forgiveness of sin. In offering the cup Jesus is gathering each of us into his life blood so that our lives may be transformed. As St. Paul says, "Now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have become near by the blood of Christ...you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but member of the household of God."

One of the prayers in honor of the Precious Blood of Jesus is the Seven Offerings of the Precious Blood. This prayer was composed by Fr. Francesco Albertini, Spiritual Director for St. Gaspar del Bufalo who founded the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Through this prayer we entrust the needs of our world to the life-giving and redeeming Blood of Christ.
