PASTOR'S PEN

In his letter to the Ephesians, St. Paul reminds us that "we have been chosen by God before the world began." Each one of us is uniquely called by God, who created us in love and knows each of us by name. Like the prophet Amos, we can't imagine that God is calling ME. Amos said, "I'm not a prophet. I didn't come from a prophetic family line. I'm a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. I'm just a common ordinary person."

Recall the context of today's first reading. Amos had been expelled from the sanctuary of Bethel by the high priest Amaziah who basically said, "take your worthless message somewhere else." But Amos stands his ground and says, "Hey, I'm not here to peddle my own message. The Lord told me, "Go, prophesy to the people of Israel." He had been summoned by God, like the disciples in today's gospel, to announce a message of conversion and hope.

Today's gospel reading from Mark, chapter six, is the third time that Jesus has commissioned the twelve apostles in this gospel. (Mark 1:18 and 3:13) In repeating this theme Mark is impressing upon us the importance of our call and response as followers of Christ.

Once we have received our call and have responded by going forth in mission we must firmly believe that God is with us, preparing the way for us. No matter what challenge comes our way, we must remain faithful because God has "blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavens." Do you really believe this?

We must believe this, and we must act in a manner worthy of our calling because "in Christ we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of our transgressions." The word redemption in Latin literally means "to buy back." Through the waters of Baptism, we are no longer slaves to sin. Those redeemed now belong to God. Jesus placed himself between life and death, offering his own blood so that the blood of others need not be shed. In this great act of love, Jesus rescued us from the powers of sin and death.

So often we do not accept the authority that has been given to us by Christ. We easily fall into doubt and temptation to sin. We fall back into slavery and deny our identity as children of God. What is something that enslaves you today? What keeps you from reaching your full potential? Jesus is with us in the midst of our struggles offering us repentance and the gift of new life.

By acknowledging our sins, we are responding to the voice of Jesus summoning us to be released from our former way of life. Jesus is calling us to place our trust in him, to take nothing extra with us on the journey of life. Our call is to be God's instruments working against evil, getting rid of negativity, envy, hate, jealousy...anything that draws us back into slavery.

In giving himself to us in the Eucharist, Jesus has given us all we need to be faithful to our call. Just as Jesus sent the disciples out two by two, we are never alone in our call to be a healing, reconciling presence to others. Despite our weaknesses God is counting on us to announce the good news of God's redeeming love in the common ordinary ways of life.

What is something that enslaves you today? What keeps you from reaching your full potential?
