#### **PASTOR'S PEN**

As we read the gospels it is not uncommon for a crowd to gather around Jesus. For some reason the people are attracted to him. Often times the crowd comes to Jesus and he teaches the crowd. Other times people are attracted to Jesus because of his ability to heal people. Last week the reason the crowd gathered was because of the "signs he was performing on the sick" (John 6:2). Today the crowd goes in search of Jesus not for teaching or healing, but because Jesus said that they "ate the loaves and were filled" (John 6:26). Jesus fed them.

"If you feed them they will come." By enlarge I would say most of us are familiar with this phrase. I would venture to guess that in most of our kitchens and dining rooms these words are not on display. But for the person cooking the meal in the home, he or she has these words in his or her mind.

"If you feed them they will come". As I reflect on this phrase I am reminded of the various ways that food brings people together. I come from a rather large extended family of aunts, uncles, and cousins. Throughout the year we get together for various holiday parties and if I were to pick a time when most of the people are there it is at meal time. For a boss trying to motivate workers to come together for a meeting, probably the best way to get everyone there is to buy them lunch. Or on a college campus if you want to get the students to come to an event, a key motivator often is offering free food and they will be there.

"If you feed them they will come". Food brings people together. Why? For us to live and for our bodies to function properly we need to eat food. So, when we feed them we are helping to sustain the lives of those we feed. Food sustains our lives physically, but I would also argue that food has the capability of not only physically sustaining our lives but also has the capability in other ways of sustaining our lives. I mean often times when people eat together it is here that relationships are created and are sustained.

Last week I presided at a wedding and at the reception they had coolie cups with the phrase "it all started with an ice-cold beverage". It is from the sharing of this ice-cold beverage that this relationship began and now this couple are husband and wife.

Or I think of the great value there is in a family sharing a meal together. It is through the sharing of food that the bonds of the family relationships get sustained. The life of the family is revitalized.

Or I think of those times we gather as parish communities to share food. I think about coffee and donuts at St. Joe that has evolved to coffee and brunch with parishioners providing other foods. Or I think of coffee and donuts at Emmanuel with the young children running and playing in the basement. Or at Holy Trinity for the soup and bread dinners during Lent with the variety of different soups that parishioners have made. Whether it is at St. Joseph, Holy Trinity or Emmanuel we have these gatherings under the hope that if we, 'Feed them and they will come'. But we feed with hope not only physically nourishing our bodies but also with the hope of building relationships in our parishes.

As we read the gospel we hear pretty regularly of a crowd gathering around Jesus. Some may say it is because of his teaching ability, his healing ability, or because they ate the loaves and were filled. These are reasons of gathering but ultimately they are seeking a relationship with Jesus. A crowd gathers in our churches each week for many different reasons but ultimately we long to be in a relationship with our God.
