PASTOR'S PEN

One of my memories of growing up in the Anthony household is that all of us had chores to do and one of those chores was washing dishes. The hardest part for me in doing dishes was the washing of pots, pans and bottles. It was easy to wash the outside of the container, but cleaning the inside took more time, patience and fortitude. The same is true of our spiritual life. It is easy to do the ritual practices of devotional prayer and coming to Mass and to feel justified and satisfied in them. Yet, Jesus is more concerned with what's going on inside our heart.

It is important that we take time to cleanse our inner self, to look inside our hearts and ask ourselves why we do the things we do. Each day we are constantly processing information that comes to us through our senses. What we do with that information is often the source of our problems and the lack of peace we experience in life.

To help us live wise and faithful lives, God gave us the Law, the Ten Commandments, to use as tools for building the Kingdom of God. Moses tells us that following this law makes for a proper ordering of society and provides an example so attractive that others would be drawn to live it.

But over time those basic laws given to Moses grew into some 613 individual laws and commandments which the Jews were expected to follow. The Law had been turned into something oppressive and was being used to keep the Pharisees in a position of power.

In the gospel, notice Jesus does not dismiss the Law but he condemns its misuse, which was clearly seen in the heavy burdens the Pharisees and some Scribes placed upon the people. For example, washing hands is a sensible thing to do but over time this rule had grown to include elaborate prayers and gestures to make sure you were being cleansed correctly. These additional rules had become a measure of a person's piety and a basis of judgment on the part of the Pharisees.

Jesus could see that the Law had become a burden and a way of rejecting those who did not observe these prescriptions of the law. The external had become more important than the internal character of a person. Jesus challenges the Pharisees to do some inner work, to look inside and to clean their hearts and motives.

That's why Jesus said, "nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile." Thoughts can become desires and desires can become action/behavior. If our conscience is not well informed we can rationalize anything to fit our wants and desires. We need to continually examine our consciences to be sure that our motives are appropriate and just.

Jesus emphasizes the need for those in positions of authority to cleanse their hearts of all impurities. This is true within our church with the recent revelations of moral corruption and compromise. One constructive response each of us can make is to identify where evil thoughts, unchastity, adultery, greed, malice, envy or arrogance have stained our hearts. We can contribute to the purification of the church by looking within our own hearts and working to purify and root out all that is sinful.

As doers of the Word of God we must continually be about the work of scrubbing our heart, mind and soul so we can present a pleasing offering to the Lord and put into practice God's law of love. Yes, it's harder to clean the inside of any container and yet we must do this inner work if we are to live in the presence of the Lord.
