PASTOR'S PEN

What is your life mission? Now that's a question to ponder! A quick google search offered a few responses. "To positively impact the life of every person I meet." "To inspire positive change through teaching and coaching." "To encourage, engage, and equip others to believe in possibilities."

On this World Mission Sunday, we may have the impression that "mission" is for those who go to foreign lands and proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ. And yet, the Church teaches that all of us are called to mission. "The Church on earth is by her nature missionary since, according to the plan of the Father, she has her origin in the mission of the Son and the Holy Spirit." "Because she believes in God's universal plan of salvation, the Church must be missionary." (Catechism of the Catholic Church par. 850 & 851)

One of the worst feelings in the world is the feeling of being alone/lonely. We are created for relationships; to be in relationship with God and with one another. Jesus gave us an example of our life mission when he quoted from the Prophet Isaiah. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...to bring glad tidings to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free." We fulfill our mission by reaching out to the needy among us, working for the salvation of all.



Today we celebrate the Feast of St. Gaspar del Bufalo, apostle of the Blood of Christ. Armed with the bible and the crucifix, St. Gaspar helped people to see beyond the reality of sin and suffering, to see a world redeemed through the Precious Blood of Jesus. When he viewed life through the lens of the Precious Blood he saw the face of Jesus revealed in every person he met. This truth stirred his heart into action!

St. Gaspar once wrote, "One must do much for God, quickly and well. We must do much because God is deserving of it. We must do it quickly because time is so short. We must do it well because that is how one must serve God." Each of us is here for a limited time and that the most important things in life are timeless. Love is timeless. Hope is timeless. Forgiveness is timeless. Joy is timeless. Focusing upon God's covenant of love sealed in the Precious Blood of Jesus our mission is to be in relationship with one another as one body working for all that is timeless.

St. Gaspar lived in a time of enormous chaos within society and the Church. Imprisoned for four years for refusing to take the oath of allegiance to Napoleon during the French Revolution, Gaspar returned home to Rome after Napoleon's defeat and brought devotion to the Blood of Christ out of the sanctuary and into the streets. A missionary to his own people, Gaspar's life mission was to preach the dignity of each person as a child of God redeemed in the Blood of Christ. He saw the crucifix as our "ladder to heaven." "By learning from it we mature in patience and in all the other virtues."

We live in a culture of division and polarization and it can be overwhelming to think we are called to fix our broken society and Church. Our focus need only be on our corner of the world, to look for ways in our life to live beyond division recognizing that "the Blood of Christ has made the two of us one by breaking down the barrier of hostility that kept us apart." (Eph. 2:14) We are to be bridge builders recognizing that "We are strangers and aliens no longer but follow citizens of the saints and members of the household of God." (Eph. 2:19) How beautiful the feet of all who bring this good news!

What is your life mission? If it is ME centered then you will eventually find yourself all alone. If your mission is OTHER centered then you are part of the missionary life of the Church.
