PASTOR'S PEN

A number of years ago when I served a Director of Vocation Ministry for the Missionaries of the Precious Blood I was in a classroom of 2nd graders talking about my vocation as a priest. I said, "Good morning boys and girls, my name is Fr. Angelo, and I am here to speak with you about my vocation." The children sat-up and were very attentive. As I started to share my vocation story I could tell I wasn't quite connecting with those little ones. Several children kept raising their hand, so I stopped and asked, "Christopher, have you thought about what vocation God has given to you? Christopher stood up and happily said," For my vocation, me and my family are going to Disney World!"

It's amazing the difference one little vowel can make in changing the meaning of a word! For many of us we are probably more excited about our vacation than our vocation. Consider the time that is spent planning and preparing for a vacation. Do we spend that much time each year gaining a greater appreciation for the vocation we have responded to in life? This week is National Vocation Awareness Week, a good time to ponder the call that each of us has been given by God.

The word vocation comes from the Latin word "vocare" which means "to call." Through our baptism, all of us have been given a call to holiness, a call to live a life rooted in Christ. For some this call to holiness will be lived out as a religious sister or brother, a priest or deacon. Many will express their call to holiness as a husband or wife, a mom or dad. Some among us will live their vocation as a single person. How we understand our call to live a life rooted in Christ is shaped as we discern our vocation and put our call into action.

So, it's not a question of finding out IF I have a vocation—everyone has one—the question is to identify, nurture and sustain the vocation God has given to you when God created you in love. Growing in relationship with God means that we seek to understand how the choices we have made in life are an extension of our baptismal calling. In what ways has your belief in God shaped the way you have lived your vocation? In what ways can you respond more fully to this call today?

One way is to reflect upon the great commandment, "To love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength and to love your neighbor as yourself." What is unique about the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob is that God desires to be in a relationship of love with us. The Greeks and the Romans served their gods out of fear not out of love. Jesus revealed the depth of God's love for us and the desire in God's heart that we be in union with the one true God.

This week ponder how God's love for you stirs within your heart a love for God and for your neighbor and how you can respond more fully to this call to love in your chosen vocation.

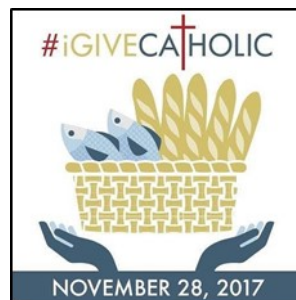

A reminder that a charitable tax break for IRA owners is permanent. Individuals who are 70 1/2 and older can transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRAs directly to charity at any time during the year. These transfers count as part of your yearly minimum distribution. There are several tax benefits of these direct IRA payouts to charity. The distributions aren't taxable and won't cause you to have extra income that could reduce your itemized deductions or personal exemptions, or trigger more tax on your Social Security benefits. Of course, you can't also deduct the donation. Contact your tax advisor for more details.
