### **PASTOR'S PEN**

For the people affected by the recent acts of hatred and violence reported in the news, the sun has been darkened and the stars have fallen from the sky. They have experienced the days of tribulation that Jesus was talking about in today's gospel. We tend to think of the Second Coming of Jesus as a mysterious future event and so why be concerned about it today? But the end times are not only reserved for the Last Judgement. Trials and tribulation will happen in the present challenging us to live our faith boldly.

Some will experience end times with the death of a loved one, when our life spirals downward into darkness and we know that life will never be the same. Others will experience end times when illness takes away their good health and their world of mobility and freedom collapses around us. We experience end ties when a career is suddenly and unexpectedly terminated and all the dreams that we wished upon a star—fall from the sky and we sit in darkness.

These are times when the world we have fashioned comes to an end and we feel helpless and lost. But Jesus assures us, "when you see these things happening, know that I am near." Jesus stands victorious over sin and death; He walks with us into the darkness and leads us to new life.

God's judgement need not be something that we are afraid of. That's why Jesus says it is not important to know when the world will end. What is important is how we are living right now. What are we doing with our lives? Jesus wants us to know that we are made for heaven!

With the resurrection, Jesus helps us to see that in the end, we are not left in darkness, violence, fear and chaos. Rather, he speaks of the tender sprouts on a fig tree and the new season of growth which will come. There is new life that comes after winter and so we live in hope. In times of darkness we can see new sprouts of life through a card or a message of support we receive from a friend and the virtue of hope leads us back into the light.

What we thought was the end of the road is merely a bend in the road, because the road we are on is the "Path of Life" a path that Jesus has already walked before us; a path he uses to lead us to life, to the fullness of joy. Living faithfully our baptismal calling here on earth we are living into our final destiny, eternal life. Through baptism we recognize that we are more than dust—that we are made of star-dust and the creation God has made will one day be transformed to shine with him forever.

**In All Things Give Thanks.** (A Thanksgiving Message from Formed.com) Each year, our country sets aside one day to focus on gratitude. For Christians, though, every day should be Thanksgiving! Not because we need a daily turkey and stuffing feast, but because gratitude is central to the Christian life.

Thomas Merton once said that "to be grateful is to recognize the Love of God in everything." With eyes of gratitude, we can see how Jesus gives us a dozen opportunities a day to love Him, even in the daily trials of life. So next time you look at your bills and begin to worry, pause, and pray "Father, thank you for this opportunity to entrust my finances to you." When your family members are fighting, pause, and pray "Jesus, thank you for the opportunity to show Your love to my family members." When tempers are short and you yell at a loved one, pause, and pray "Holy Spirit, thank you for teaching me humility and giving me the grace to go apologize." Every day, God wants to teach us gratitude. May this Thanksgiving season help us cultivate thankfulness in our lives.
