PASTOR'S PEN

Today we begin a new liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent. Our scripture readings for Mass will come from Cycle C of the Lectionary which highlights Luke's gospel. This gospel is sometimes called the gospel of the lost and found because many of the parables St. Luke recalls will draw us into the mercy and compassion of God. Thanks to Luke's gospel we have the beautiful nativity story and the message that God came not only to save the Jewish people but also the Gentiles as well.

The word Advent comes from the Latin word 'Adventus' which means 'coming.' In this season we not only recall the time of old when a tired and weary world awaited a savior, but we also look forward to the second coming of Christ. In this season we reawaken our hope in the salvation that has been given to us through the redeeming blood of Christ.

Rather than hearing about John the Baptist announcing the coming of the Messiah our gospel reading for the First Sunday of Advent draws us to reflect upon the second coming of Christ in glory. The Lord is coming at a time we least expect. As we wait for the Lord we must be vigilant and wait with patient endurance always seeking to be attentive to the hand of God at work in our lives.

With the gift of faith given to us in baptism we celebrate the life we have been given in Christ, a life that is eternal. Yes, there will be challenges and bad things happening in this word, but we must not despair. God will never abandon us. We can trust in his promise that no matter what happens, he will give us a peace that surpasses all understanding—if we trust in him.

Here in the Northern Hemisphere, the season of Advent takes place during the darkest days of the year when there is the least amount of sunlight. Advent stands in the midst of darkness as a season of hope because we believe that the light of Christ can break through any darkness. Hatred, unforgiveness, racism, the abuse of life, pornography, poor self-esteem, indifference to human suffering, turning a deaf ear to someone in need...these are all examples of darkness in this world.

Our work is to be about the transformation of the world—one person at a time, one experience at a time. As we begin our Advent journey it is important to identify where darkness has entered your life and to hear the call to move from darkness into light.

- Is there something I can do to radiate the light of Christ in the midst of a cold, dark and hardened world? Is there a simple act of kindness that I can do to warm the heart of another person?
- In this Advent season can I see my waiting as a gift calling me to slow down and to re-order my priorities, to wait for what God wants instead of what I want?
- Can I say I'm sorry or forgive someone who has hurt me in order to thaw a relationship that has been stone cold?

The Lord says to us through the Prophet Jeremiah, "The days are coming when I will fulfill the promise I made to you and your ancestors in faith." In our waiting we are to be as excited and attentive as a child waiting for Christmas or a young couple awaiting the birth of their first child.



As we wait in hope St. Paul offers a prayer for us,

"May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all."

Let's use this Advent season to wait in hope and to share the joy that we have found because of the life we share in Jesus Christ.

Retirement Fund for Religious - A second collection will be taken up at Mass the weekend of December 8-9th in support of senior Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests whose communities lack sufficient retirement funding. Ninetythree cents of every dollar raised directly aids elderly religious; the remainder is used for administration and promotion of the appeal. This appeal continues to serve a crying need as hundreds of religious orders lack sufficient retirement savings, due in part to historically low compensation for their ministry. "Most senior religious worked for years for small stipends and did not receive retirement benefits." For example, the average annual Social Security benefit for a religious is \$6,453 while the average U.S. beneficiary receives \$16,849. Religious communities are financially autonomous from the parish and diocesan structures of the Catholic Church and are solely responsible for the support and care of their members.
