#### PASTOR'S PEN

Growing up in a household of eight children, Sunday mornings could be a challenge. Inevitably one of us was lagging behind the others in getting ready for Church and we would hear Mom or Dad say, "Hurry up, get dressed and let's go."

In today's First Reading, the Prophet Baruch is speaking to the people of God who are suffering in exile at the hands of the Babylonians around the year 587 B.C. Baruch's prophecy is a word of hope because he sees that the time is coming when God will overthrow their captors and lead them safely home. Therefore, they are to put aside their robes of mourning, disappointment and misery and put on the mantle of faithfulness, justice, mercy and peace.

The prophets remind us that God did not just create man and woman to be left to their own demise. Over and over again throughout history God has intervened in the lives of his people preparing the way for that day when he would send his only son.

The gift of salvation is not some fairytale story that happened onceupon-a-time. In today's gospel Luke is very specific about when the events leading up to the birth of Christ took place. He carefully writes, "In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee...the Word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the desert." Luke wants us to see that the coming of Christ is an important part of the world history in which God is fulfilling his promise to bring salvation to the whole world.

God continues to intervene in human history through the Church, the sacraments and the many encounters we have through the power of the Holy Spirit. The words of the Prophet Isaiah and John the Baptist are important for us to hear today. "Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight his paths." All too often we wonder aimlessly through life taking all kinds of curves and detours in our sinfulness. Advent calls us to straighten the road in our heart so that we head straight to the Christ and the light of His truth.

History has shown us that we cannot save ourselves. We need God and the path to God is justice, righteousness, repentance, compassion and generosity. Even though the going gets tough we are to follow St. Paul's example and offer a message of hope and encouragement to others. St. Paul wrote the message of today's second reading from prison. By the tone of his message we can tell that his heart was not clothed with disappointment, worry and misery. Rather, his heart was dressed with confidence, love and hope as one redeemed in Christ. It's as if he could see Jesus on the horizon and he reassures us that the best is yet to come!

As we prepare for Christmas, we are not just to decorate our houses, shop for gifts and bake holiday treats, we are to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Lord in glory. In doing so, we may need to enter the wilderness of the desert by disconnecting from social media, the internet, the shopping malls and the hustle and bustle of the season so that we can refocus our heart to the things God wants us to experience. We must take off the clothing of impatience, negativity and a "bah-humbug" attitude and put on the clothing of love, peace and hope.

Once we are appropriately dressed we need to get going on the journey to the manger so that we can encounter Christ anew. We need not worry about the obstacles we will encounter along the way because they are simply opportunities for growth and greater trust in God. What we see on the horizon in this holy season is not just the celebration of the event of the birth of Jesus, but the advent, the coming of Christ in glory.

Each time we respond to God's grace we catch a glimpse of what will be in the Day of the Lord and renew our hope in the promises that God has made. In this second week of Advent be aware of what you are wearing and where you are going for our salvation is near at hand.

For example, the average annual Social Security benefit for a religious is \$6,453 while the average U.S. beneficiary receives \$16,849. Religious communities are financially autonomous from the parish and diocesan structures of the Catholic Church and are solely responsible for the support and care of their members.
