PASTOR'S PEN

While doing some last-minute Christmas shopping, Clara Null was rushing her grandkids into the car. As she was closing the door, four -year-old-Jason said, "Grandma, Susie has something in her pocket." He reached into Susie's pocket and pulled out a new red barrette. Though she was tired, Clara knew it was important for Susie to take the barrette back to the store, apologize to the manager, and put the item back where she had found it. So, they did just that. Later, they stopped for a few quick groceries. At the checkout, the clerk asked, "Have you kids been good, so Santa will come?" Big brother Jason said, "I've been very good, but my sister just robbed a store."

One of the characteristics of good parenting is that parents first tell their children what is good and right and then they show them what is good and right through the example of their lives. When we reflect on salvation history we can see that God is like a loving parent. First God TOLD us through the prophets, then God SHOWED US through his Son how we are to live our lives each day so that we will be ready when Christ comes in glory.

In the season of Advent this message comes across clearly in our readings as we reflect upon the words of the prophets of old like Isaiah, Zephaniah, Baruch, Micah and John the Baptist. God sent the prophets to tell us how we are to prepare for the Day of the Lord.

As you will recall, John the Baptist lived a very austere life dressed in camel hair and eating locus and honey. His message of repentance was strong and forceful. True to form, he didn't mince any words when various people came up to him and asked, "What should we do?" John had proclaimed the clear message that the day of the Lord was near and so the people wanted to be ready. He tells them and us to be generous in sharing what we have, to be honest and to be satisfied with what we have received from the Lord.

In this Advent season the question "What should we do?" is very appropriate for us to reflect upon. What should we do to prepare for Christmas? Following John the Baptist's comments, here are a few questions for reflection. Am I being generous with the poor or am I just concerned with my family or circle of friends? Am I being honest in my relationships and living fully the vocation I have chosen? Am I content with what I have or am I restless and dissatisfied with my life?

In the consumer-oriented world in which we live our lives can quickly get out of focus and the preparations we are making for Christmas can easily become a burden rather than a cause for joy. It need not be that way for us. What should we do? St. Paul says to us, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your request to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Jesus is the image of the invisible God who has shown us what it means to be fully human.

On this third Sunday of Advent our hearts are growing in expectation and joy as we prepare for the coming feast of Christmas and the second coming of Christ in glory. Joy is not something we create but is the fruit of living with the confident assurance that God is always with us. As Christmas draws near ponder the gift of Jesus, the Word made Flesh, who loves us unconditionally, who delights in us, who is never outdone in generosity! When we encounter God's love for us we are inspired to return that love to God and to share it with others. This Advent we know what we should do. Keep your priorities rooted in God for he is the cause of our joy!
