

## ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S PEN


"As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ" (1 Corinthians 12:12) Paul uses this to explain how each one of us is a part of the body of Christ and regardless of what part of the body we are, each part of the body is necessary and has a part to play. But you know sometimes when we are a part of something, we fall into the temptation of either seeing how the part that we contribute is not important to the whole or to say that our part is the most important and no other part is needed. At times like this we are invited to take a step back and acknowledge how our part is necessary to the larger picture or to recognize the need for others.

My Grandpa Keller in his retirement had many hobbies to occupy his time. Some of these hobbies included building bird houses, fishing and hunting, gardening, and after Grandma died, he picked up baking. During this time of the year when the cold weather kept him inside, he would build puzzles. And not only would he build puzzles but once he had a puzzle together, he would glue the pieces to a board and then put a frame around it and hang it up in the house. Just like the way you would hang any other picture in your home. I have one of his finished puzzles of the Last Supper in my office.

One day I was visiting with Grandpa marveling at the picture on the puzzle he just put together. As I was marveling, Grandpa asked me "Do you know what the most frustrating thing about putting a puzzle together is?" "No, perhaps, finding the right pieces that fit together" I said. "That is frustrating. But the most frustrating thing is putting all the pieces together and discovering that you have one piece missing." While I do not regularly put puzzles together. I understand Grandpa's frustration. I mean you put all that time into putting the puzzle together and then discover a piece to the puzzle is missing. Our puzzle and picture is incomplete. There is a hole in the puzzle because the piece is missing. The beauty of the picture is lost because of the missing piece to the puzzle. Each piece to the puzzle is necessary. In each piece connecting we get a completed puzzle and a full picture. In the Last Supper picture, the piece that makes up Jesus hair is just as necessary as the piece that is part of the floor. In just the same way each one of us is a piece to the Body of Christ and at times we may feel like we are that piece that is the floor to the picture. For many this piece that goes unnoticed and would seem not to be important, but without that piece to the puzzle the picture is not complete. At other times we may be the piece that makes up the face of Jesus. It is a piece that is the focal point of the picture; some may argue that this is the most important piece but you know without this piece connected to others it is just a piece to a puzzle.

As we journey through life at different times, we may feel like what we have to offer is too little. At other times we may feel like what we have to offer is everything and we do not need help from anyone. Regardless of how little or how much we have, we have been called to give and depend on others to share what they have with us. For it is when we contribute to doing our part that we contribute to the building of the Body of Christ.
