PASTOR'S PEN

In our readings today, we hear about several prophets of the Lord— Jeremiah, Elijah and Elisha, who faced rejection and suffering when proclaiming God's word, yet, persevered in their calling as a testimony to their love for God and God's people.

Jeremiah found his strength in the awareness of God's love for him, God who knew him before he was formed in his mother's womb. The Lord says to Jeremiah, "They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you, says the Lord." (Jer.1:19)

In a similar way, Jesus meets with some pretty strong resistance when he points out that God's love is open to all people. God's healing presence was not just for the chosen people of God, but also for gentiles, those unbelievers whose new faith proved to be a source of life for them. Staying true to Jesus' commitment to love unconditionally He accepted the way of the cross.

How do you remain strong in the midst of the challenges of life? One answer is found in the priorities we live by in life. In thinking about priorities I'm reminded of a teacher who stood in front of his class, holding a large pickle jar. Without saying a word, he took out a box of rocks, each about two inches in diameter, and put as many rocks into the jar as it would hold. He asked the class if the jar was filled. The class agreed that it was.

Then he brought out a box of small pebbles. He gently poured them into the jar, filling the open spaces between the rocks. Again, the teacher asked the class if the jar was full. "Yes," they said, "Now the jar is really full!"

Then the teacher brought out a bag of sand. He poured the sand around the rocks and pebbles, filling whatever little spaces remained between the rocks and pebbles. Then the teacher held up the full jar: "This is your life," he explained. "The rocks are the important things in life like love, faith, family, friendships, honesty, health, prayer, care of life and created things. The pebbles are other things that matter in life like your house, job, education, hobbies and interests. The sand is everything else, the small stuff in life.

"If you put the sand in first, there will be no room for the rocks and pebbles. If you focus on the small stuff in your life, there won't be any room for the important things that matter."

Keeping love as our top priority in life enables us to fully mature into the person God created us to be. Living in love is all about breaking free from our own wants and desires in order to direct our efforts for the good of another person. In doing so we allow ourselves to be vulnerable to another, letting go of control of what others will do with what we offer.

St. Paul reminds us that I can have all the riches in the world or speak heavenly languages or have faith to move mountains, but if I do not have love, then I am nothing. Love is patient and kind because the focus is not about what I want, but what is good for the other. When we're quick-tempered it's because we are focused on ourselves and on our agenda rather than the other person.

Love is being willing to put up with all things for the sake of the other person...like the small things that get on your nerves at home or at work. Love is not about keeping score in a relationship but remaining grounded in gratitude for the other. Love does not insist on "my way" but sees the world as "us" and "ours." Yes, there will be arguments in relationships—but love for the other will always steer you in the direction of taking the first step toward forgiveness and healing.

Love will never fail because God is love. God is our rock of strength, the source of our salvation. Living the law of love is challenging, but it's well worth the struggle! How do your priorities stack up in relation to the primacy of love?
