PASTOR'S PEN

Wanted: Sales Associate...job responsibilities include interacting and assisting customers, maintaining a neat, organized and clean sales floor. Wanted: IT Help Desk Technician...responsible for supporting the IT department of a multi-location manufacturing company, overseeing the company's computer systems and helping associates with technology issues.

Employers use ads like this to make sure they attract the right person for the job they are seeking to fill. In our scripture readings today, we see that God is seeking people to fill certain positions to further the building of His Kingdom on earth.

In our 1st reading God is looking for a prophet to announce His message to the Israelites. In our 2nd reading God has narrowed his selection to Paul who has been chosen to bring his message to the gentile people. In the Gospel Jesus has his eye on Peter to be a future leader for his church.

Reflecting upon today's readings, it may seem that Isaiah, Paul and Peter were NOT the right choice for their appointed job. Isaiah was a man of unclean lips. Paul was one who persecuted the church and killed Christians. Peter was a common fisherman who confessed his sinfulness. One consistent theme in scripture is that God chooses the weak and makes them strong for His service. Even though we may feel unworthy to serve God, we see over and over again that "God does not call the qualified, God qualifies the called."

Through the waters of baptism, God has chosen you and me, sinful and imperfect people, to fill his "Help Wanted" positions. It is amazing how much confidence God has in us! Take Peter's call from the Lord. Don't you think it was a bit presumptuous of Jesus to just come along and take over Peter's boat? He didn't ask Peter if he could rent his boat for an afternoon of preaching. No, he simply gets in and asks Peter to put out a short distance from shore.

I can imagine that all of us here today can relate to this experience where God steps into our life and pushes us out into deep water, pushes us to respond to a need that we don't feel qualified to handle. Like a new Mom and Dad taking their first-born child home from the hospital...there's not much of an instruction manual that comes with the baby. Or think of a time when you were asked to take on a new job or to volunteer for something outside your field of study or work. Or maybe God used you as an instrument of hope for someone who was sick. Life throws us surprises, God pushes us to step out into deep water, stretches us to go beyond our comfort zone to show us that there are amazing possibilities beyond what we can imagine when we trust in Him.

In their journey of faith Isaiah, Paul and Peter all experienced a vision of the Lord that brought them to their knees; not out of fear but in recognition of the majesty of God which overwhelmed them. It's like living in a world powered by 20-watt bulbs. When we have that epiphany experience of the hand of God at work in our life, the world is as bright as a 100-watt bulb. We see more clearly our imperfections and deem ourselves unworthy to come before the Lord. Yet, God looks deep within our hearts and draws upon the untapped potential within each of us. It is amazing how much confidence God has in us!

What we come to see in the journey of faith is that sinfulness does not exclude us from being called by God to serve him. Saints don't always start out as saints, just look at Isaiah, Peter and Paul. Thankfully, there is hope for all of us! God will do amazing things through us when we respond to his call and say,

"Here I am Lord—send me."

Fr. Emmanuel's Word of Thanks. "I want to sincerely thank you for all the prayers you offered on my behalf. I am back safely, thanks to your prayers. I cannot adequately articulate what I saw with my own eyes. The country of Cameroon is experiencing chaos and lawlessness with the ruling class interpreting and applying the law to suite his/her ego and motivation. People are being brutalized, maimed, killed and property extorted.

Despite all this, the faith of the people endures; they pray in the buses as they move from one town to another. They sing and dance, and the churches are full to capacity on Sundays, and almost full on weekdays. I said Mass every day in areas that were safe and gave the people the message of hope and love. The people remain hopeful, but many places are deserted; people are homeless, no food, no clothes.

I did not see my parents and other family members because I could not pass through some unsafe areas of the country. For the first time, my mother told me on the phone not to try to come. I could feel the pain in her voice. I carried out my research for my dissertation to the best of my ability. With God on our side, who can be against us? Gratefully yours, Fr. Emmanuel
