## PASTOR'S PEN

During Holy Week, the church in her wisdom gives us three days to ponder the events of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. On Holy Thursday, we reflected on St. John's account of the Last Supper which focuses on the washing of the feet of the disciples and the call to service. After Jesus had washed their feet he asked, "Do you realize what I have done for you?"

On Good Friday, this question lingered in our minds as we walked with Jesus in his passion and death. From the cross he looks upon us and says, "I love you so much!" "I am willing to do anything for you."

As we celebrate Easter, we stand in awe of the Risen Christ and his victory over sin and death. With great excitement Jesus says, "Do you realize "What I have done for you?" I think it's safe to say that most of us do not always recognize this great gift and we move through life dissatisfied, frustrated, worried or preoccupied by the challenges of life.

St. Paul reminds us, "If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above...for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God." In the waters of baptism we die to a world that is solely earth-bound and we rise to live in a world that is touch by the presence of the Holy Spirit. The very life of God has entered us! We are temples of God's Spirit. The journey of Lent reminds us that each day we are called to empty ourselves so that we can put God first in our lives.

Because of the life we share in Christ, there is within each of us the potential to be a saint! So, how do we allow the Risen Lord to take over our hearts? How do we leave the tombs of lost dreams and failed hopes behind? We look to Jesus. We gather often to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus to nourish us. We reflect upon scripture and foster a prayer life that helps us to grow in wisdom, the ability to see as God sees.

Today, like Mary of Magdala, Peter and the Beloved Disciple, we can see with the eyes of faith that Christ is risen. Alleluia!

- This is the day the Lord has made let us rejoice in the hidden life that we share with Christ in God.
- This is the day the Lord has made let us look deep within our hearts and strive to become saints of God.
- This is the day the Lord has made let us humbly receive the Body and Blood of Jesus and allow him to shape our hearts into his heart of mercy.
- This is the day the Lord has made, a day when our faith is strengthened, and we hear the call like St. Peter to announce the Good News of the Risen Lord.

### Health Ministry Lenten Pilgrimage...

Kolkata (formerly Calcutta) is the capital of India's West Bengal state. It is home to Mother House, headquarters of the Missionaries of Charity, founded by Saint Teresa of Calcutta, whose tomb is on site. In 1950, Mother Teresa, and the small community formed by her former pupils became the Diocesan Congregation of the Calcutta Diocese. Their mission was to care for "the hungry, the naked, the homeless, the crippled, the blind, the lepers and all those people who feel unwanted, unloved, uncared for throughout society, people that have become a burden to the society and are shunned by everyone." With 19 homes in Calcutta, a school for street children, and a leper colony, the mission began as a small community of Sisters with 12 members. Today there are over 4,500 Sisters running orphanages, homes for those dying of AIDS, charity centers worldwide, and caring for refugees, the blind, disabled, aged, alcoholics, the poor and homeless and victims of floods, epidemics and famine in many countries.

**Reflection:** "How can we love God and His poor - if we do not love each other with whom we live and break the Bread of Life daily together?...Love each other in the eating of this Bread of Life; and serve each other and Him in His poor by giving your whole-hearted service." p 57.
