PASTOR'S PEN

Mickey Mantle, the New York Yankees Hall of Famer, once recalled a game in which he struck out three times in a row. He said, "When I got back to the clubhouse, I just sat down on my stool and held my head in my hands, like I was going to start crying. I heard somebody come up to me, and it was little Timmy Berra, son of Yogi Berra. He tapped me on the knee, in a soft kind of way, and I figured he was going to say something nice to me---you know, like, 'Don't give up or Hang in there." But all he did was look at me, and then he said in his little kid's voice, 'You stink!"

The disciples had a similar assessment of their actions. All of the events that they experienced recently left them demoralized, disappointed and deflated. When the going got tough, they ran away in fear and doubt. Their inner voice said, "You stink at being a disciple of Jesus." Even though they had recently encountered the Risen Lord behind locked doors, they just couldn't imagine Him ever trusting them again. Put yourself in their shoes. Have you ever let someone else down? It's hard to face that person again because you not only disappointed them but you disappointed yourself.

Jesus is helping the disciples to see that failure is a part of life. And just because you fail doesn't mean you are unworthy to be a messenger of the Lord. We must learn from our mistakes and continue on the journey. Nobody is a failure until they quit trying. And so, Jesus is working to restore their identity as children of God through the gift of His reconciling love.

Jesus recognizes the broken relationships and the disciples' inability to understand reconciliation and forgiveness. And so, Jesus, the victim, prepares an environment of welcome and hospitality so that reconciliation can take place. In the Christian understanding of forgiveness, the victim always takes the first step. By providing a familiar meal and listening to their story, Jesus heals the stinking thinking of the disciples by reminding them that love is stronger than sin and death. What's most important is their love for Jesus! If Jesus forgives them, now they must forgive themselves and others. In turn, they are to share the Good News of the Father's love and mercy to the whole world.

This is our call as well. Even if we stink at being disciples at times, the love of God will heal us and Jesus will say once again, "Come follow me." Believe it or not, as our relationship with Jesus grows, one day we will even be able to rejoice in being found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name of Jesus and it will all be worth it for an eternity of glory.
