PASTOR'S PEN

Many of the infomercials that you see on the television use fast talking announcers who are filled with excitement about their brand-new product; they go on and on about the merits of this new product. "There's nothing like it on earth!" Listening to the description about the product you begin to wonder how you ever made it through life without this amazing new thing.

If there is anything that captures our attention and increases our excitement it is the prospect of receiving something new. Whether it is new clothes, a new book, a new friend, a new home, a new baby, a new iPhone or a new gadget, we all enjoy receiving something new. Yet, time teaches us that anything new will become old, will wear out and soon be replaced by something else.

Realizing this reality, we might be a bit skeptical hearing the word NEW used so often in our scriptures readings this weekend. In the reading from Revelation we heard, "*I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth, a new Jerusalem coming out of heaven.*" Then the Lord said, "*Behold, I make all things new.*" And in the gospel Jesus speaks of a new commandment, "*Love one another as I have loved you.*" So why should we pay attention to this promise of something new when we know that everything on earth will get old? The gift of the Easter season we celebrate reminds us that it is Christ himself who has done something new. Because of his life, death and resurrection we all hold a different script in our hands. Sin and death no longer have power over us!

Through the Risen Lord we have received a new spirit, a new heart, a new attitude, a new purpose, a new focus and a new reason for living. All of this is expressed in the new commandment of Jesus, "love one another." Now you might be thinking that love is nothing new. Love has been around long before Jesus. So, what's so new about this commandment? The answer is found in Jesus and the example he set for us. We are to follow his example of love, which is nothing less than embracing the cross, a total giving of self for the life of the world. This love is always new because we share in the same relationship of love that Jesus shares with the Father and the Holy Spirit, a love that is eternal.

In today's gospel, we join with Jesus as he begins his farewell address with his disciples at the Last Supper. He is going away and will no longer be with them in the same way. The disciples think to themselves, "Great—just as we get to know the guy, now he's going to leave us!" Little did they know about what was coming next. In John's gospel the cross is not seen as a sign of defeat, but rather, it is a sign of glory. Five times in today's gospel Jesus speaks of the glory that is to be revealed, not in the way the disciples expected, but in a new way...through his victory over sin and death, his act of sacrificial love.

Because Jesus is the source of our salvation, he will always be intimately connected with us. There's no getting rid of him. Even when we wander from him or get lost in fear or question how things will ever work out in the future, Jesus says to us, "*Behold, I make all things new.*" Evil, no matter how powerful it may seem, will never conquer the world. Jesus Christ is victorious. God is ultimately in control. If you want to live a full life then live a life of love that is modeled upon the love of Jesus. Love boldly like Jesus and you will see things and experience things you never thought possible.

Health Ministry Pilgrimage... Tamil Nadu, Mangalakudi

St. Gaspar Parish was recently built in the Diocese of Sivagangai and staffed by C.P.P.S Missionaries. The Church is built close to the site of the martyrdom of St. John the Britto, SJ. This is a pilgrimage site dedicated to the patron Saint of the Diocese. St. John de Britto entered the region as a Jesuit missionary from Europe and became the bedrock of faith for thousands of people. He was beheaded at Oriyur on Feb 4, 1693 by a regional king for preaching about Jesus Christ and establishing churches.
