PASTOR'S PEN

Back in the 15th century, a Russian artist named Andrei Rublev painted an icon entitled "The Trinity." The artist used the image of the three angels who came to Abraham and Sara in Genesis Chapter 18 as a way of expressing the divine love found in the Trinity. In the picture, the angels are seated around a table with a spot open for the person viewing the icon. Like Abraham and Sarah, we are all invited to welcome the union of the three divine persons into our lives and to extend the unity shared at this table of love with our families and our world.

Throughout His ministry, Jesus revealed the relationship of love between Father, Son and Spirit and the gift of this love shared with us. Referring to this mystery, Jesus says: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now." It's not that the disciples or we are academically challenged--it's more a question of the mystery found in this relationship of love. The mystery of the Trinity is not a puzzle to be solved but a relationship of love to be experienced over a lifetime.

Some of you may be familiar with the prayer of St. Richard of Chichester, a 13th Century English Saint who wrote: "Three things do I pray, O Lord, to see thee more clearly; to love thee more dearly; to follow thee more nearly day by day." In the first person of the Trinity we pray to see God, the father, more clearly by recognizing that all humanity is created in the image of God and called to live in the love of God. Secondly, we want to love God more dearly by following the example of Jesus, the Son, who gave of Himself unconditionally for the life of the world. Thirdly, we want to follow God more nearly by allowing the Spirit of God to work in and through our lives.

In the gift of the Trinity we see that God is a family, a community of persons sharing life together in such a loving way that what flows forth is joy, peace and gratitude, the very energy for life.

One of the earliest and most challenging lessons that children need to learn is how to share. We begin life believing the world belongs to us. When children are challenged to share what is theirs a tug of war often breaks out and soon everyone is in tears. Learning to share is an essential component of our faith because we are not placed upon the earth to simply take care of ourselves, but to be good stewards of the gifts that God has given and to share what we have for the life of the world.

This message hits home in the story of a man named Bill who diedand as he was drawing near the pearly gates Bill made a request, "Lord, before I enter heaven, can I first visit Hell?" The request was granted and as Bill approached the gates of Hell he could hear weeping and hateful yelling. Passing through the gates he saw a huge room with endless rows of banquet tables filled with the most appetizing food possible. YET, all of those present were starving. Taking a closer look at the site Bill saw each person holding a long fork. The fork was so long that no one could get food into their own mouth because of the strict rule that all forks had to be held at the end of the handle.

Seeing enough, Bill turned toward heaven and as he entered the pearly gates he heard the sounds of laughter and joy. To his surprise, heaven looked exactly like Hell with endless rows of tables and a wonderful variety of food and everyone had those long forks in their hands along with the same rule as in Hell: "All forks must be held at the very end of the handle." No one could feed him or herself. But, there was a big difference. Everyone in heaven was eating happily as each person was feeding their neighbor across the table."

The mystery of the Holy Trinity reminds us of the importance of sharing our lives in a communion of love as is found in the relationship of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. To help us grow in unity we are given families and communities as schools of charity. Certainly, in the life of a family we learn to practice patience and forgiveness, but we also learn that sometimes we can be selfish and immature.

To celebrate the gift of the Holy Trinity, simply sit down at the table with family and friends, let the food, wine and conversation flow, and experience the life that comes when we live in union with the Holy Trinity.


