PASTOR'S PEN

Several years ago, I was talking with a person who had left the Catholic Church to try the Ginghamsburg church on I-75. She was looking for a place that was more in tune with the times, a place that was relaxed and used multi-media for worship. After about a year, Elaine noticed that something was missing in her life. Over time she came to see that she had a real hunger for the Eucharist and decided to return to the Catholic Church because her deepest hungers could only be filled with the Eucharist, the Real Presence of Christ received at Mass in the Body and Blood of Jesus.

For Catholics, the Eucharist is at the heart of our religious life. As the years go on, our love for the Eucharist does not decline with age, but rather, increases, and our participation in this mystery draws us into a place of greater trust and intimacy with God.

Melchizedek, who was a king and a priest of God the Most High recognized the hand of God at work in his life and in the life of Abram. In a prayer of thanksgiving for Abram's victory over four other kings, Melchizedek offers a sacrifice of thanksgiving using bread and wine, signifying the staples of life. This offering is a foreshadowing of the Eucharist just as the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish is a foreshadowing of the Eucharist.

Like the people in Luke's Gospel we come to Jesus in the Eucharist as a people in need of healing. All too often our culture looks to medication as a quick fix for pain in life. The advertisements for Advil, Tylenol, Aspirin and Excedrin show the face of a person in great pain. Within thirty seconds the person is shown smiling, happy and resuming normal activity because they took the right pill. This picture lulls us into thinking there is a "quick fix" for all our problems in life.

But, Jesus doesn't offer us a quick fix. Life is not that simple. The Eucharist is not a wonder drug. It does not change our human condition. Rather, "the Eucharist changes how we view ourselves and our world. Through the Eucharist we come to see that God's grace and life are in the world. The Eucharist helps us to move forward in spite of fear, despair or anger, helps us suppress unkind words and thoughts toward others and neutralizes destructive behavior. When we turn to the Lord in the Eucharist instead of relying solely on ourselves, we find the courage, resolution and perseverance to work on those matters in our life that need to be changed." (Quote by Wilfred Theisen OSB)

One day a man was driving home from work and he decided to stop and watch a little league baseball game. As he sat on the bench behind the 1st base line, he asked one of the boys for the score. We're behind 14 to nothing he said with a smile. Really, the man said. You don't look very discouraged. Discouraged?!--the boy asked with a puzzled look. "Why should we be discouraged? We haven't been up to bat yet!" The Eucharist strengthens us to never give up because here we receive food from heaven which connects us to eternal life.

In today's gospel, only Jesus is able to provide food for such a large crowd. Like the disciples we often look at life with the mid-set of scarcity; "There is not enough for everyone." We look at our shortcomings and limitations and miss the abundance that is possible when we connect our lives to Jesus. The abundance of bread given to us by Jesus will always be enough to satisfy the hunger of the world.

Whenever we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus may we be aware that the Real Presence of Jesus is with us to fill our every need and to strengthen us so that we may respond like Christ to whatever comes our way today, building up of the Body of Christ, as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ.
