PASTOR'S PEN

In today's gospel, Jesus and the scholar of the law agree that the great commandment is to love God with all your heart, being, strength and mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself. To justify himself, the scholar asks, "But who is my neighbor?" Is it my brother, an acquaintance, the family next door, a friend, a stranger or even an enemy? Jesus answers the question by shifting the focus from seeing a neighbor as someone we encounter in life--to seeing one's self as the neighbor.

When we look at the first reading, Moses teaches us that there is nothing mysterious about this commandment of love. It is found within our mind, upon our lips and in our hearts—we only have to carry it out. We are reminded of this each time the gospel is proclaimed and we trace little crosses on our forehead, lips, and heart as a gesture reminding us to invite the Word of Christ to change our minds, so that our lips proclaim God's truth that is found in our heart.

Jesus tries to open the mind and heart of the scholar of the law by using a parable involving a Priest, a Levite and a Samaritan. The hero in the parable is the Samaritan, a person that would have been seen as an enemy to the Jews because the Jews looked upon the Samaritans as half-Jews. During the time of their exile by the Assyrians in 722 BC they intermarried with pagans making them unclean.

In the parable, the Priest and the Levite who were expected to know more about the love of God ignored the man who was beaten, walking on the other side of the road to avoid him. On the other hand, the Samaritan who was seen as an enemy of the Jews is held up as a model to follow, he was neighbor to the man who was hurt; he was the face of mercy.

Have you ever tried to ignore someone by walking the other way or not answering their phone call or pretend that you didn't see them in a crowd? As long as they remain anonymous to us we feel justified, but we have failed in being neighbor and failed in our love of God.

The Priest and the Levite probably felt sorry for the man along the side of the road but that is not mercy. As Fr. Kosicki says, "Mercy is having a pain in your heart for the pain of another person that moves you to action." The Samaritan approaches the man left for dead-cleans his wounds with wine, treats them with oil, puts him on his animal and takes him to an Inn to receive care.

These details are important. At some point, Mr. Samaritan packed for a long 23-mile journey which is the distance between Jerusalem and Jericho. He took oil to cook with and wine to drink because there would not have been any clean water along the way. Responding mercifully to the man in need, the Samaritan uses the wine as an antiseptic and the oil becomes a salve for healing. He puts the man on his mule, and once they reach the inn he uses the money he saved for supplies to care for the man. Imagine the shock in the eyes of the beaten man when he realizes that his enemy, the Samaritan, saved his life. Mr. Samaritan used his time and resources in a much different way then what he intended. His heart opened up and he shared what he had with someone in need.

Jesus asked the scholar of the law, "Which of these three, in your opinion was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" The scholar of the law had to swallow hard, and he doesn't even use the word Samaritan...he awkwardly responds, "The one who treated him with mercy." In other words, love of God and love of neighbor cannot be separated. You and I are to be neighbor, to be the face of mercy, to anyone in need.
