PASTOR'S PEN

Three men were discussing the best way to pray. One man said: "The best way to pray is in church." The second said: "I pray best standing with my arms outstretched." The third man said: "I think the best way to pray is kneeling." Overhearing their conversation, an electrician said: "For what it's worth guys, the best praying I ever did was hanging from a telephone pole during an electric storm."

The last several weeks we have been journeying with Jesus as he goes up to Jerusalem. We heard the story of the Good Samaritan and what it means to love God and neighbor. Last week we heard of the importance of spending time with Jesus in the account of Martha and Mary. Along this journey Jesus is forming his disciple to understand more clearly their relationship with God. Today the focus is on Prayer. Both the first reading and the gospel draw our attention to the importance of prayer and more specifically, to be persistent in prayer.

You might describe prayer as a personal response to the felt presence of God in our lives. We believe in God who has created us in love and through the life of the prophets and Jesus we have learned that God seeks to be in a personal relationship with us.

A key component of any relationship is communication. Prayer is our communication with God. Prayer can take many forms, like public prayer in the Mass, devotional prayer like the rosary, meditative and contemplative prayer. Prayer can find expression in the form of music, art, dance and it can be experienced in nature.

In the first reading we see Abraham in a conversation with God. It seems like an unusual conversation, like Abraham is bargaining with God in the way a merchant and a customer haggle in the marketplace over the price of some article. How about if there are 50 innocent people, 45, 30...10! The beautiful message we receive in this exchange speaks about the mercy of God. God is so amazing that He is willing to be merciful to a whole population found in two cities for the sake of a few people.

In his prayer, his communication with God, Abraham offers us an example of how important it is to be honest and persistent in prayer. He is not trying to sugar coat the situation. He knows how bad Sodom and Gomorrah are...and yet he still speaks out on behalf of the people. Is there anything or anyone that we feel like giving up on? Any situation that we believe is hopeless? Be persistent in prayer...do not give up! God is listening!

For a model as to how we are to pray, Jesus gave us the Our Father prayer. It is a prayer in which we place our complete trust in God. This is why some people will pray this prayer with open hands, to symbolize an openness to allow God to put whatever God deems is needed into their lives or for God to take out of their lives whatever is necessary.

The daily bread we receive today and each time we come to the Eucharist is the body of Christ given for our life and the life of the world. We come with our daily hungers to be filled, our worries to be lightened, our fears to be calmed, and most especially our sins to be forgiven. St. Paul reminds us of this gift when he states: "our transgressions have been nailed to the cross, they are forgiven!"

And so, in faith we gather today taking to heart the instruction of Jesus: "Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." We don't just ask once, we are persistent and honest in our prayer, presenting whatever we are feeling, pouring out our hearts so that they can be filled with the gifts of the Spirit needed trust God unconditionally. In humility we realize once again that we must abide in God's time and not ours and that with God all things are possible.
