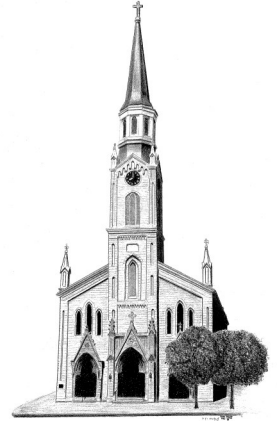

PASTOR'S PEN

One week ago, we awoke to the news of the mass shooting in the Oregon District of Dayton. The news sent shockwaves throughout the city and nation. Yet another shooting all in the span of a week following El Paso, Texas and Gilroy, California. Horror, tragedy, sorrow, devastation were words used to describe these shootings. Sadness, frustration, fear and hopelessness were emotions expressed. The scripture passages offered for our reflection this weekend provides a path for us through this time of darkness.

By reflecting upon our faith tradition and history we can find the strength we need to continue our journey faithfully. In our reading from the Book of Wisdom we are invited to recall the night of Passover. God's chosen people trusted in faith that God would protect them and free them from oppression. There was a sense of vigilance as the people of Israel "girt their loins and wore sandals on their feet and applied blood on the lintels and doorposts of their homes. Then for forty years God molded and shaped their hearts as His chosen people.

Digging deep into our faith tradition, we can draw strength from the life of Abraham, our Father in faith. Abraham and Sara obeyed God's call to leave behind all that was familiar to them. God promised that they would have descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky. Trusting in faith meant a willingness to sacrifice Isaac, placing their future unconditionally in God's hands.

In Luke's gospel we are given timely words of comfort, "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom." We belong to God's "little flock" and the treasure of eternal life has been promised to us in baptism. Just as God cares for the birds of the air and the lilies of the field, so much more does God care for us. We find strength in the promise of what will be. Sin and death do not have the last word. Jesus is risen and with us!

Belonging to God's flock means that our value comes from being adopted children of God. Our value is not found in material treasures or other people's opinions or the job we do. God has made a tremendous investment in us. Through the Precious Blood of Jesus our lives have been purchased and our sin washed away. Just as God has treated us with such dignity and respect, we too are called to honor the dignity in each person created in God's image and likeness.

That is what makes the tragedies of gun violence and any violence so appalling. The total disregard for life afflicted on so many innocent people challenges us to work even harder to promote the culture of life. What will our investment be toward this mission we have been given to see the face of Christ in each person we meet? As we await the master's return do we act justly and love unconditionally?

Persevering in faith means that we are willing to journey here on earth without setting our own agenda and without knowing where God will lead us. Sometimes we will be led into the desert for purification. This may mean the loss of all that is dear to us, the "Isaac" in our life. Sometimes it means taking up the cross of illness or standing up for what is right.

In calling us to trust in faith Jesus is sending us like lambs among wolves as we heard in the gospel several weeks ago. To be a person of faith is to be a Good Samaritan, stopping to help someone in need. Faith involves keeping a balance between being a Martha and a Mary. When we pray as Jesus taught us we trust in God to provide each day our daily bread. Faith is not focusing our life on building earthly riches but storing up treasures in heaven. Living faith is being vigilant for the master's return by not growing lazy, complacent or cynical. Journeying in faith means our hearts are restless and continually at work until Jesus comes in glory.

How do we live this faith? We do so by walking with others as they make their way from grief to consolation, from being lost to having purpose, from guilt to forgiveness, from loneliness to belonging, from anger to peace, from sickness to health, from despair to hope. By bringing others to Christ, and building a community of faith, we will be found ready to meet the Lord when He comes in glory. As someone once said, "There is the here and the here-after; where is your heart!"

Thursday, August 15th, the church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that "Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians." (CCC 966)
