

PASTOR'S PEN

Over the last couple of weeks, I've seen area students practicing hard for the new season of sports. Their commitment involves a firm plan of action guided by the coach, a willingness to make sacrifices, a desire to excel, a capacity to accept loss and the determination to keep moving forward toward their goal. The same can be said for our journey of faith. The sacrament of baptism opens the door for the gift of eternal life, but it is not our free ticket to heaven. We must actively prepare for the coming of the Lord.

Luke's Gospels says that Jesus was making his way to Jerusalem. He knew where he was going and what the cost of this journey would mean...suffering and death. Jesus could have gone into hiding or just sat along the side-lines of life but that was not what he was sent to do. In the same way, we must be clear about our call and where we are going in life. Remember Alice, from Alice in Wonderland, when she was at a crossroad, she had a conversation with the cat which can be summarized in this way, "If you don't know where you are going any road will take you there." Do you know where you are going in life or do your actions reveal someone who is wandering aimlessly through life? If we claim heaven and eternal life with God as the true desire of our heart then we must be willing to be disciplined out of love, to make sacrifices, to be open to the cross, to be committed and determined to follow Jesus who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

When Jesus was asked to identify how many will be saved at the end of time, he responds by saying "try to come in through the narrow gate." In doing so Jesus is putting the responsibility back on the individual, on each of us to write our own story. The gate is narrow not to exclude people; rather, the gate is narrow because you don't need a lot of stuff to enter the Kingdom of God.

Jesus is asking us to stop and think about how we are living our life. Do I spend a lot of time and energy building up my possessions? In reality, none of them will fit through the narrow gate. Do I carry a grudge or hold resentment over a past hurt? Holding another person in un-forgiveness will keep me from passing through the narrow gate because I'm not sharing the same mercy that God has extended to me and therefore God will not recognize me as one of his own. Is my schedule so full that I don't have time to pray or grow in my faith and so in the end will I be able to find the narrow gate? Could the reality of illness or aging and the loss of independence and freedom lead me to doubt and fear that maybe there isn't even a gate to pass through? Carrying all of this excess baggage will rob us of peace and we will easily fall into despair.

Jesus is the Way; He is the narrow gate we are to pass through. He has taught us to reach out in love to the poor, the forgotten and to the sinner. When we are able to reach out in love to someone else we are letting go of self and can easily pass through the narrow gate. The gate is open for us. We can choose to accept the gift of salvation by walking with Christ or we can reject the gift by what we say or do or by what we fail to do. The choice to receive the gift of salvation is up to us and we may even be surprised as to who we will see in heaven. Someone described this unexpected reunion in heaven by writing the following poem.

I dreamt death came the other night
And heaven's gate sung wide.
An angel with halo bright - Ushered me inside.
And there, to my astonishment
Stood folks I'd judged and labeled
As quite unfit, of little worth--and spiritually disabled.
Indignant words came to my lips--but never were set free
For every face showed stunned surprise.
Not one expected me!

Evangelization Series Part 3. Why do we Evangelize? Because Jesus told us to! Before he ascended into Heaven Jesus told the apostles to, "Go out and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit" (Mt 28:19). We are commissioned at our baptism to share the Good News! Pope Francis says, "All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization..." (*Joy of the Gospel*, 120). As one theologian said, "the church doesn't have a mission, the mission has a church!"

Our baptism gives each of us the right and the responsibility to evangelize. This is true regardless of our level of instruction in the faith and regardless of our role in the Church or in our parish. What does this mean? You don't need a theology degree or advanced training to be able to evangelize. You don't need to be a priest or a deacon or on parish staff or in professional ministry or on the parish council or the evangelization committee or have any title whatsoever in order to evangelize! How does Jesus' words in Matthew's challenge you in your baptismal call to share his love to others?
