### **PASTOR'S PEN**

Dear Parishioners: Thank you for your prayerful support of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood as we gathered in Poland for the 21st General Assembly of our Congregation. Every six years delegates meet to discern new leadership for our world-wide Congregation and to set an agenda of apostolic priorities to guide us into the future. We currently have Members serving in 15 units throughout the world.

Going into the General Assembly I was aware that my name was being shared among the delegates to serve in the role of Moderator General, the head of our Congregation who resides in Rome, Italy. Six months ago, I began a discernment process with my spiritual director to listen for the Lord's voice as I prepared for the Assembly.

When I look back on my vocational journey, I can say that I never desired or dreamed of going to a foreign country to serve the church like some people are called to do. My facility with other languages is very limited and I knew the challenge of building a strong network of support while doing the work of administration and animation in an international setting.

Though I had nearly half the votes in the straw ballot, I made the decision to withdraw my name from nomination. My heart was telling me that such a position would stretch me beyond what I was called to do as a Missionary of the Precious Blood. This shifted the voting and after three rounds of ballots Fr. Emanuele Lupi from our Italian Province was elected Moderator General.

One of the options for a member chosen to serve on the Moderator's General Council is the possibility of being a non-resident Councilor who lives in his home country rather than Rome. This person travels to Rome a couple times

a year for extended meetings and then

participates from home via the internet. Since this was an option, I told the assembly that I would be open to a position as a non-resident Councilor.

When the voting took place for the 1st Councilor's position, which is also the position of Vice Moderator, my name came up and I was elected on the first ballot. It seems I am looked upon as a wisdom figure in the group. I guess that is one of the hazards of having white hair! The other three Council members elected are Fr. Augusto Menichelli from Canada, Br. Juan Auña (a member of our Province originally from Chile) and Fr. Alois Schlacter from Austria.

Within this new scenario I will continue to serve as your pastor. This additional position will necessitate pulling out of a few of my commitments with other groups, but I am confident that I will be able to manage the responsibilities within this pastoral region. We have excellent staffs in each of our parishes, a youthful parochial vicar in Fr. Matt and a pinch-hitter in Fr. Ken who can be pulled

from the retirement dugout to lend a hand. Also, please know that all expenses related to this new position will be covered by the Precious Blood Community.

I am at peace with the decision of the Assembly and believe we have a good working team and guiding assembly document to build upon over the next six years. I am also happy to be able to continue the ministry God has called me to in our Pastoral Region and ask for your continued prayerful support as we move into the future together, working to build the Reign of God.

A reminder that a charitable tax break for IRA owners is permanent. Individuals who are 70 1/2 and older can transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRAs directly to charity at any time during the year. The tax law that passed December 2015 made this tax break permanent. These transfers count as part of your yearly minimum distribution. The distributions aren't taxable and won't cause you to have extra income that could reduce your itemized deductions or personal exemptions, or trigger more tax on your Social Security benefits. Of course, you can't also deduct the donation. You may want to consider this for any future contributions. Contact your tax advisor for more details.
