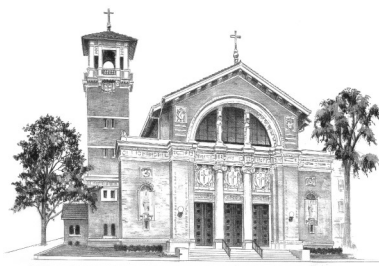

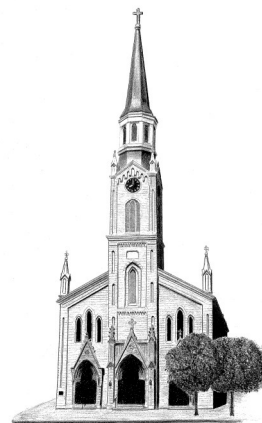

PASTOR'S PEN



On Sunday, October 13, 2019 Pope Francis will declare five new saints: Indian Sister Marian Thresia, founder of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family; Italian Sister Giuseppina Vannini; Brazilian Sister Dulce Lopes Pontes, and Marguerite Bays, a Swiss consecrated virgin of the Third Order of St. Francis and Cardinal John Henry Newman.

St. Newman was a 19th century theologian, poet, Catholic priest and cardinal. Originally an Anglican priest, he converted to Catholicism in 1845 and his writings are considered among some of the most important Church-writings in recent centuries.

Ordained a Catholic priest in 1847, he was made a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879, although he was not a bishop. Newman's conversion to the Catholic faith was controversial in England, and resulted in him losing many friends, including his own sister who never spoke to him again. The British cardinal founded the Oratory of St. Philip Neri in England, and was particularly dedicated to writing, education and the founding of two schools for boys. He died in Birmingham in 1890 at the age of 89.

St. John Newman once wrote, "I will trust God. Whatever, wherever I am. I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. He does nothing in vain. He may take away my friends. He may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide the future from me. Still, He knows what He is about."

In today's gospel the nine lepers had faith that Jesus could heal them. I can imagine they had gratitude in their hearts for the healing gift they had received but they did not translate that feeling into thanksgiving. Here we see the difference between gratitude and thanksgiving. Gratitude is a feeling of appreciation that we experience in our hearts. Thanksgiving is the act of putting that feeling of gratitude into action by giving thanks to the giver. It is not enough to feel gratitude--we must also take time to acknowledge the giver of the gift.

Like the Samaritan leper who returned to Jesus to give thanks, we have come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God who saves us. When we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, a word that means thanksgiving, we give thanks to God for the gift of His creative love at work in our lives. Thomas Merton once said: "To be grateful is to recognize the Love of God in everything He has given us - and He has given us everything. Every breath we draw is a gift of His love, every moment of existence is a grace, for it brings with it, immense graces from Him."

The Blood of Christ reminds us that God's love is for all people. This truth motivates us to follow the example of Jesus by responding to the crying needs to those less fortunate than us. When we worry, we deplete our sense of gratitude. The way to worry less is to give thanks more. As someone once said, "Faith is not about everything turning out okay; faith is about being okay no matter how things turn out, because you know you are a beloved of God." That's the faith St. Paul expresses in our second reading as he is suffering in prison; in the midst of his pain he rejoices in the Lord, offering his suffering for the sake of those who will come after him.

Today, we are thankful that Jesus accompanies us in our journey through life, healing us and leading us to salvation and glory. As 14th century theologian Meister Eckhart reminds us, "If the only prayer you say is "thank you" that would be enough."

Next weekend we will celebrate the Solemnity of St. Gaspar, founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, with special prayers & readings for his Feast Day.
