PASTOR'S PEN

If you were to consider a building that stands as a symbol of the Catholic Church in the world today I can imagine that many of us would think of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Built over the tomb of St. Peter this amazing structure with its high dome and rounded colonnade is ready to welcome and receive all people with the mission of drawing them closer to Christ. The symbolism of this building and its importance to us can be compared to the ancient Temple in Jerusalem. The Temple served as the center of the Jewish faith; it was the place where God could be found on earth.

In today's gospel Jesus overhears some people talking about the beauty of the magnificent Temple building "adorned with costly stones and votive offerings." As massive and impressive as that building was Jesus declares that the Temple will be destroyed and not only that, there will be destruction that comes from war, natural disasters and personal persecution.

From one generation to the next there have been people who have tried to predict when the end of the world will come. Jesus does not get caught up in this guessing game. His response is to reassure us that He will provide for our need when the time of destruction comes our way. We are given this warning of pending doom and destruction so that in the face of these challenges we will remain strong in faith and not lose heart because the Day of the Lord is coming.

When trials and tribulations in life come our way, it is so easy to be caught up with fear, worry, doubt and even despair. Even though we do all that we can to guard against danger, there is still an element of fear that enters our life because of an uncertain future. Jesus instructs us to keep our focus on Him and not on the trials and tribulations. It's like a person seeking to be rescued from a tall building that is on fire. The firefighter tells the person, "Don't look down. Just keep your eyes on me. I will take care of you."

When we are confronted with personal trials and persecution Jesus tells us not to worry, that He will give us the wisdom we need to respond to the challenge and the words that we are to say. Reflecting on today's Gospel Pope Pius XI once wrote: "The temples we build, once adored with precious stones and votive offerings will crash upon our heads. For reasons unexplainable to us, God will seem to disappear. Jesus will seem silently dead in the grave. Prayer becomes dry and barren. All we see is fire and stubble and chaff. But this is not the last word--Jesus reassures us and says, 'By your perseverance you will secure your lives.'"

Over and over again in scripture God tells us to keep our eyes on Him, "Do not be afraid." Rather than focusing on the doomsday message that comes with trials and tribulations, Jesus asks us to nurture the virtues of hope and trust. Scripture reminds us that the Day of the Lord is not about destruction and fear. The Day of the Lord is all about a new beginning that comes when we die to an old self so that we can be made new and become more and more like Jesus.

Even though we know all earthly things will pass away we still must be involved in the work of building the Reign of God. The saints teach us that even the simplest of acts ought to be seen as our contribution to God's plan of salvation. When we see our work as part of a larger plan, then we find renewed strength, hope and even joy in life.

Living faithfully our baptismal calling here on earth we are living into our final destiny, eternal life. Through baptism we recognize that we are more than dust—that we are made of stardust and the creation God has made will be transformed to shine with Him forever. "By your perseverance, you will preserve your life and you will be ready for the Day of the Lord."
