PASTOR'S PEN



One of the familiar sounds that we hear in the course of a week is the sound of sirens announcing that some type of emergency vehicle is on the way to a fire, to the hospital or on the move to stop someone living outside the law. When we hear a siren, we are to slow down, look around and be prepared to respond as needed.

John the Baptist was one such siren announcing the coming of the Messiah. He proclaimed, "Reform your lives, the reign of God is at hand." Slow down, stop and look around, otherwise you might miss the mystery of God's love being revealed. John is not asking us to add another thing to our already busy schedules and preparations. He is challenging us to allow Christ to be a part of our day-to-day experiences, to let His light be our guide. We are to keep our focus on Jesus rather than the number of shopping days until Christmas. The Advent season celebrates God's longing for us and our response to that longing we feel in our hearts.

During the Advent season our attention is also drawn to the Prophet Isaiah. He tells us that "In the day of the Lord, the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb...the calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them." In this vision, creation is restored to the original harmony that God intended when he created the world, a harmony lost by the sin of Adam and Eve. Ever since, God has been working to bring reconciliation and peace to our world so that we might "with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Romans 15:6)

In God's plan to draw us back to this original blessing, He chose the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the worthy vessel for His Son. As one chosen to be kept free from original sin, Mary is often called the New Eve. Growing up, Mary had no idea that she had been born sinless. Her parents didn't coach her saying, "You're going to be the Mother of the Messiah." Rather, they helped Mary to develop a life of faith that enabled her to trust in God completely; even when the angel was telling her something that was humanly impossible.

The witness of the Blessed Virgin Mary announces clearly the beauty that comes from obedience to God and trusting in God's Will. When we are attentive to God's presence, our lives will have a centering point that will help us to do amazing things for the Lord. Unfortunately, even though we are aware of the gift we share as children of God, it is easy for us to settle for something less than who we are created to be.

The miracle of Christmas seeks to draw us back to our original blessing so that we can experience anew the joy, peace and unity that comes to us in Christ. This time of year, we work extra hard to be more patient, more understanding and more accepting of one another. In doing so we are restoring the harmony that was lost by the sin of Adam and Even in the Garden of Eden.

During our Advent journey the Church offers us these three important role models to help us rediscover the dignity we share as children of God. John the Baptist calls us to repent. The Prophet Isaiah invites us to recognize God's original dream for us. The Blessed Virgin Mary announces how important it is to trust God in all ways!

God will judge us not by appearance or how nicely we prayed; God will judge us by justice, the kindness we shared, the mercy and forgiveness we extended to others. We must be willing to remove the darkness of sin and live in the light of truth which respects the dignity of each person as a child of God. Living into God's dream for us we will transform the world. Today we must ask ourselves, "What needs to change in my heart and mind so that I can live in harmony and lasting peace?" God is ready to enter our heart...we must be ready to receive this gift.
