#### **PASTOR'S PEN**

This weekend we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, a Latin word which means REJOICE! Like excited children counting down the days to Christmas we too wait in joyful hope for the coming of our savior, Jesus Christ.

For some, this joyful season is clouded by that long list of things to do; or maybe joy feels distant because of the death of a loved one; or maybe it's hard to rejoice and be hopeful when there is so much uncertainty with the future. In the time of the Prophet Isaiah the people of Israel were living in fear. Their knees were weak, unable to carry the burden of worry and stress. Isaiah offers them hope, reminding them of God's care for them and God's plan to bring them home.

The scripture readings selected for the Advent season emphasize the truth that there is no situation, no problem, no matter how dark or hopeless it is...nothing stands outside of God's transforming love. This is an important message for us today because our world, filled with advancing technology and cyber communication, can cause us to think that the answers to life's problems should be found as easily as popping a meal in the microwave or looking up an answer on the internet.

That is why our second reading from the Apostle James is so important for us today. He reminds us that patience and perseverance are keys to a joy-filled life. Look at the farmer who awaits the yield of the soil. He can't just look at a seed and say, "Ok seed, grow." He must prepare the soil, plant the seed; cultivate its growth all the while realizing that it is God who brings about the growth of the seed. In a similar way, the journey of life takes work, patience, hope and a belief that God is bringing all things to the good.

The spiritual journey is all about getting in touch with the dream that God has placed in our hearts, that dream for unity, that ability to see the hand of God at work all around us. Jesus said, "the Kingdom of God is in your midst." The season of Advent tries to reconnect us with the memory of our salvation in Christ who became a little child. We believe that Christ dwells with us revealing the goodness and mercy of God.

This is the cause of our joy! The gift of joy is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit which comes from living in right relationship with God. Happiness comes from outside of us and does not last. Joy comes from within and is rooted in our hearts by the Holy Spirit. It is a gift available to everyone, even those facing great challenges and heartaches can know joy.

Last week we heard that John the Baptist thought the Messiah was going to come with fire, destruction and damnation and so we can understand his confusion as he inquires about Jesus from prison, "Are you the One who is to come?" Jesus responds by reminding John of what the prophet Isaiah said about the coming Messiah, the blind sees, the deaf hear, the mute speak the lame leap for joy! The fire that burns is the fire of God's love that burns away sin and evil making all things new!

- On this Gaudete Sunday we rejoice in the example of the many people of faith who give witness to the hope that is found in the promise of God's covenant of love.
- We rejoice in the circle of family, friends and parish community that God gives to us to support and encourage us.
- We rejoice in Jesus who gives us His Body and Blood to strengthen us so that our lives can reflect the light of His love to others.
- We rejoice in the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ who lifts our drooping spirits, forgives our sins and shares with us the Good News that we are God's precious children.

**Symbols of Christmas.** "The traditional Christmas tree is a very ancient custom which exalts the value of life, as in winter the evergreen becomes a sign of undying life offered by Christ. In general, the tree is decorated, and Christmas gifts are placed under it. The symbol is also eloquent from a typically Christian point of view: It reminds us of the 'tree of life,' representation of Christ, God's supreme gift to humanity. The message of the Christmas tree, therefore, is that life is 'evergreen' if one gives: not so much material things, but of oneself: in friendship and sincere affection, and fraternal help and forgiveness, in shared time and reciprocal listening." (St. John Paul II, Dec. 19, 2004)
