### **PASTOR'S PEN**

How long has it been since you stopped to look up at the stars in the night sky? Stars have a way of lifting us beyond the restrictions and limits of this world, to contemplate with wonder and awe God's creative plan for our world and for all eternity. Stars have a way of reassuring us that in the midst of darkness and the challenges of life the hand of God is with us holding all things together.

In today's gospel, the Magi follow a star that caught their attention at its rising and their commitment to follow that star led them to Jesus, the true Light of the world. They are the stars of today's feast because they humbled themselves in the presence of the Lord.

Like the people in the time of the Prophet Isaiah, we can get stuck in a rut or become lost in self-pity or depressed by the darkness we experience around us. When this happens, we are focused on what we need to live on rather than focusing on what we live for. What we need to live on means we are concerned with taking care of our physical needs. But, what is most important in life is to know what we live for because this is what gives meaning and purpose to life.

The feast of Epiphany reminds us that God desires for us to live for Him alone. When trying to get our attention God often uses ordinary things in nature to call us to service. Think of Moses and the burning bush or Elijah hearing God in a tiny whispering sound. In the narrative of the nativity, God uses a new star to get the attention of the Magi.

Even though they were foreign gentiles, God was calling the Magi to a journey of conversion. As gentiles they were not familiar with the Jewish scripture or traditions and so it must have come as a surprise to them that the Jewish leaders were not excited about the news of the birth of the new-born King. After giving them the location of his birth, the Jewish leaders showed no interest in joining the search.

When the Magi get to the house of the new-born King of the Jews they prostate themselves, meaning they fell down in worship. Their response was one of faith and the gifts they offer are highly symbolic. The gift of gold was given because it was the most precious of metals and anticipated the crown of gold that this new-born king would wear. The gift of frankincense is a sweet incense that was used in the temple for worship and sacrifice. It is a gift appropriate for a priest. The word priest comes from the Latin word "pontifex" which literally means "bridge builder." Jesus is the bridge between heaven and earth. The gift of myrrh is an aromatic sap added to oil which was used to anoint kings and to prepare a body for burial. This child who is the Son of God has come into the world to give his life to save us from sin and death.

The Light of Christ has led you to the presence of Jesus in this Eucharist. What is the gift that you want to give to the Christ child? Maybe your gift to Jesus is a commitment to put God first, to be more aware of what you are living for in life. Maybe your gift is working to get rid of a bad habit that leads you into darkness? The gift God desires from us is a gift that comes from the heart, a gift that reflects the Light of Christ in the world.

As we begin this New Year be aware of the stars in your life that God is using to lead you to Jesus, the true Light of the world. Consider how blessed we are to encounter Jesus Christ, not in Bethlehem, but in the gift of the Body and Blood of Jesus that we share today. Look up and see the glory of the Lord. Let His light shine through you like the stars that shine in the sky.

**Epiphany House Blessing.** On the Feast of the Epiphany families are invited to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. We invite Jesus to be a part of our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrow.

### **PASTOR'S PEN Continued...**

Let us pray: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying: May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. Amen. (Prayer from Catholic Book of Blessings USCCB)

To mark your home for Christ, you can use chalk to write above the home's entrance or somewhere inside the house using the following markings: 20 + C + M + M + 20. The initials, C, M, B, remind us of the names of the three magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar) or the Latin phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house".
