PASTOR'S PEN



Today the church comes to the close of the Christmas season. It's always a little sad for me to take down the Christmas decorations, to pack away the ornaments on the tree; the cookies are eaten, the lights stored away, the wrapping and boxes recycled...it seems a little dull to return to our surroundings to ordinary time. The Church in her wisdom puts the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord at the end of the Christmas season to emphasize the point that

the truth and beauty of Christmas does not end. Rather, like Jesus, we are entrusted with a mission given to us at the time of our baptism, to die with Christ so as to live with Him forever; to follow His example of unconditional and unselfish love.

The beautiful reading from the Prophet Isaiah we heard today is one of the four traditional servant songs which speak of God's plan to save his people from sin and death. It is very clear that God is the one who has chosen the servant. The Lord says, "I called you; I grasped you; I formed you and set you as a light to the nations." In this passage we see that the mission of the servant is determined by God, not by the servant. And so, in the Gospel Mark wants us to be clear in our understanding that Jesus is the one anointed by God through the power of the Holy Spirit, to fulfill the mission of the Father, a clear revelation of the gift of the Holy Trinity.

In all four gospels the story of the baptism of Jesus is told with the appearance of the Holy Spirit coming in the form of a dove. This image takes our minds back to another time in scripture, the Book of Genesis, when the same "Spirit" hovered over creation with a dove coming back to Noah after the great flood. (Gen 8:11) The gospel writers want us to know that the "coming of Jesus" represents a new beginning for all creation. The coming of Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promise to Noah not to doom creation again, but to provide us with a path that will lead us to divine life. The Word of God became flesh and consecrated all creation!

The words spoken by God the Father, "This is my beloved Son; with whom I am well pleased," are also the words that we were privileged to hear at the time of our baptism when we became children of God. Ask yourself: Can you see yourself as a beloved son of God? Can you see yourself as a beloved daughter of God? This truth may cause us to blush with shame a bit because we know our shortcomings and failings. And yet, our failings do not destroy the "original dignity" we are given in baptism as a son or daughter of God.

So often the biggest problems that we have in life are because we do not claim or accept who we are as children of God. We live in the shadows of doubt trying to fill the hole in the soul with stuff or with behavior or other people's opinions that we think will give meaning to our life. Or we set our sight and energies solely on the goal of being successful when all God asks of us is to be faithful. Finding and claiming our identity as sons and daughters of God in the waters of baptism enables us to cut through all the confusing and competing voices that come at us in life.

Each time we dip our fingers into Holy Water we are reminded of our baptism and the identity we have been given as children of God. It is by reason of our baptism that we are worthy to come before the Lord, not because of anything we have done.

To live my baptism is to live in the awareness of being a child of God. To live my baptism is to live the call to holiness, to turn away from the selfishness of sin and follow the path that leads to eternal life. To live my baptism is to put into practice the relationship of love that is found in the communion of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Hear God say to you today, "You are my beloved child, live in me as I live in you."
