PASTOR'S PEN

In today's second reading, St. Paul wants us to know that the primary challenge in life is to guard against sin. Deep in our heart we know what is right and good and yet we are so easily tempted to reject God by falling into the need for immediate gratification, self-satisfaction and control. Thankfully, God always sees the person He created us to be and despite our weakness, God loves us and shares with us His compassion and mercy.

In today's gospel, the devil tempts Jesus in three ways. First, to seek immediate gratification by turning rocks into bread. Second, to test God's promise of protection by throwing himself off a high tower. Lastly, to seek worldly wealth by receiving all the worldly kingdoms.

Maybe none of us have ever wandered in the desert for forty days, but we have all had desert times in our life...a time when you felt lost, empty, unfulfilled, disconnected from God. At these times, Satan comes with the perfect plan. He knows our weaknesses. Jesus is hungry from fasting for 40 days, so he is tempted to end his hunger by turning stones into bread.

What hungers are we tempted to feed when we get lost on the internet for hours, when we are unfaithful to a commitment, when we take things that don't belong to us, when we gossip about others or criticize them, when we hurt others with our words or seek Revenge. The devil says, do whatever you need to stop the pain, the emptiness, the fear in your heart. The danger is our actions can easily become habits and all too soon we've created another Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde, an image of self that is far removed from the person God created us to be. Just like Jesus, we must refuse the temptation for personal control and trust in God alone to provide for our need.

As one author notes, "There is only one way to be free of the sins that so easily hooks us, and that is to open ourselves to God's grace, His forgiveness and His love. Only by looking to Christ, the new Adam, can we escape the curse of the old Adam." There is nothing that any of us can do on our own to free ourselves from the power of sin at work in our lives. Positive thinking won't do it. Personal discipline won't do it. Blaming someone else won't do it. Relying on self-control won't do it. Christ Jesus is our only hope. When we accept God's gift of grace that comes to us from Jesus, then we are set free from the power of sin.

On Ash Wednesday, we were confronted by the sober truth of our sinful, human nature. The ashes we received on Wednesday remind us that we are guilty and we need God's mercy. Thanks-be-to-God this is not the end of the story. It is in and through the sacrificial death and resurrection of Jesus that we encounter the true mercy of God and are reminded that God is God and we're not.

Today, we look to Jesus as our role model...one who was tempted in every way yet remained faithful to the Father. Make the words of Psalm 51, your humble prayer today: "A clean heart create for me, O God, and a steadfast spirit renew within me. Cast me not out from your presence, and your Holy Spirit take not from me. Give me back the joy of your salvation and a willing spirit sustain in me."



The Lenten season is a time for us to examine our lives and consider how we might return to the Lord. Returning to the Lord includes seeking God's forgiveness and mercy through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Once again, parishes of the

Archdiocese of Cincinnati will participate in the initiative, "The Light Is On for You," providing a diocesan-wide opportunity to go to confession on a single evening. Priests will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation by offering private confessions on Tuesday, March 24 from 7:00pm – 9:00pm.
