PASTOR'S PEN

We miss you! The "stay-at-home" order that we are living under has changed our normal routine in life and has caused us to reassess many aspects of our life. Many things we counted on are not available to us. We have truly gone into the desert with Jesus and are much more aware of the various hunger pains (spiritual, social, emotional and physical) that come with the restrictions we are experiencing.

One huge hunger not is being able to receive Jesus in Holy Communion. Many parishioners have commented on how much they miss receiving Jesus, to experience his presence at Mass. You may have heard the old saying "Distance makes the heart grow fonder." In this time of social distancing and distancing from receiving the Eucharist we are given an opportunity to let that hunger teach us. We are more aware of our brothers and sisters who can only receive the Eucharist once a month in developing nations. We are more aware of this precious gift God has given us to sustain us in life. We are more aware of the strength that comes when we gather for Mass and pray and sing together with one voice to God our Creator.

God is guiding us through this desert time and offers his angels to care for us in prayer, word and deed. May we not lose heart or grumble but offer this time of suffering to Jesus and allow him to transform this suffering into the gift of new life.

This weekend our homily reflection is offered by Fr. Steve Dos Santos who is the Director of Vocation Ministry for the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and has been a substitute priest in our Pastoral Region for a number of years.

Jesus is Right There with Us

And Jesus wept. (John 11:35)

These words, often noted as the shortest verse of the Bible, remind us of something very important Jesus' emotions. He has already told his disciples and Martha that Lazarus would rise. He clearly knew what he was going to do and yet when confronted with the tomb of his friend Lazarus, he wept. His heart expressed the truth of his love for his friend.

This should not surprise us. How many times does Scripture tell us that Jesus was moved with pity when faced with someone's suffering? Does Scripture not tell us that it was out of compassion that he fed the crowd in the desert? Didn't his anger overflow in the face of the vendors taking advantage of people in the Temple? Jesus had a full emotional life, and so when finally confronted with the tomb of his friend, he wept.

During this time of pandemic, stay-at-home orders, and toilet paper hoarding we experience all sorts of emotions: fear of getting sick, anxiety over limitations on our activities, anger when we see others flaunting public health orders, and even sadness over not being able to receive the Eucharist. All of these feelings are real and appropriate.

Today's Gospel reminds us of two very important things in the face of the current crisis. First is that no matter how bad things may be, God is in control. God's love for us is stronger than any problem we might be facing. Yes, even as we stay home, worship via livestream, and practice "social distancing," God is ever near. That doesn't mean that he's going to make this trial go away. It is a cross we must carry, just as Martha and Mary had to carry the cross of their grief for those four days.

And Jesus himself grieved, knowing full well that he would bring Lazarus back to life, he still wept out of love for his friend. Therein lies the second lesson of this Gospel. As we run through the gamut of emotions Jesus is right there with us, not just in this moment of crisis but all the time. His love for us is so great that when we cry, he cries with us. And when we laugh, he laughs with us. So deep is his love for us that in the midst of whatever we are feeling, he is there feeling it with us.



That can be particularly difficult to remember in this time of no public Masses, and for most Catholics of no reception of Holy Communion. To be separated from Christ in this very real and physical way has been a hardship. It has angered some and saddened others. I can only imagine what Jesus is feeling as he watches his Church journey through this moment. I can only imagine the sadness Jesus is feeling knowing that we are unable to receive Him in the Eucharist.

Jesus is journeying through this moment of crisis with us. He is feeling what we are feeling, and he wants only to raise us up. He is here, with us, right now. His only desire is to love us and to give us his grace. And just as He brought Lazarus back to life, he will bring us back. But first He weeps with us.

Retired Archbishop Daniel E. Pilarczyk, who led the Archdiocese of Cincinnati for 27 years died on March 22 at the age of 85. Archbishop Pilarczyk had strong ties to our Pastoral Region in Downtown Dayton. His parents, Daniel and Frieda Pilarczyk were parishioners at Emmanuel Church. When little Daniel was born on August 2, 1934 his parents brought him to Emmanuel Church to be Baptized on August 19, 1934 by Fr. Moorman.



Judi Trick, Business Manager at Holy Trinity Church, recalls the Trick and the Pilarczyk families getting together every Saturday to play cards. Young Daniel played the violin and he encouraged Judi to learn to play the violin as well.

Fr. Angelo was ordained a Transitional Deacon by Archbishop Pilarczyk back in 1988. "The Archbishop could tell I was nervous in taking this next step toward the Priesthood and reassured me that I had nothing to fear, that God would give me what I needed to be a faithful shepherd."

"Archbishop Pilarczyk was an educator and author whose work focused on explaining the Catholic faith to wider audiences." His brother bishops recognized him as one of the outstanding churchmen of his time, electing him as president of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB) and also chair of every significant committee of the bishop's conference. "His wit and wisdom were legendary within the Conference."

Archbishop Schnurr came to know Archbishop Pilarczyk 30 years ago when he was serving as Associate General Secretary of the NCCB and Archbishop Pilarczyk was President. When Pope John Paul II decided to hold the 1993 World Youth Day in the United States, Archbishop Pilarczyk turned to then Fr. Schnurr and appointed him to plan and coordinate the event. Some of Archbishop Schnurr's comments concerning his friendship with Archbishop Pilarczyk can be found on the Archdiocesan website..

During his tenure, Archbishop Pilarczyk ordained more than 100 priests and three bishops. The archives of the Archdiocese show that he confirmed more than 74,000 people. His leadership helped prepare the Archdiocese for a future with fewer pastors by initiating the "For the Harvest" program in the late 1980's. He was a faithful shepherd of the Lord.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Archbishop Pilarczyk's funeral Mass was private at St. Peter in Chains cathedral in Cincinnati on March 27th. A Memorial Mass is being planned for the public at a later date.


