

PASTOR'S PEN

Our gospel reading for Easter Sunday begins where Good Friday ended—in a cemetery. "Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb." (John 20:1) In many cultures it is a traditional practice to go to the cemetery on Easter Sunday to remember loved ones and to live in the hope of the resurrection.

There was once a six-year old boy named David who was taking a walk with his grandmother. On their way home, they decided to take a detour through the local cemetery, stopping every once in a while to read the headstones. Grandma explained that the first date on the tombstone was the day the person was born, and the second date was the day the person died.

"Why do some of the tombstones only have one date?" David asked. "Because those people haven't died yet," his Grandma explained. David was obviously puzzled by his Grandma's explanation because that night he couldn't stop thinking about their visit to the cemetery. "Mommy," he said with wide eyes. "Some of the people buried in the cemetery aren't even dead yet!" (Don't Stop Laughing Now, 2002)

Leave it to a six-year old to put a different twist on life and death. When we stop and think about it the gift of Easter puts the greatest twist of all on life. Easter says that all who are buried in Christ are not dead at all; for them life is changed not ended.

And yet, like Mary of Magdala, there are times when the Risen Jesus seems far from our eyes. For some of us it has been difficult to celebrate Easter while we continue to follow the stay-at-home order and are not able to gather for Mass and receive the Eucharist. Maybe the Lord feels distant because of sickness, loneliness or family difficulties. Sometimes the tears that come from grief or loss can blind us from seeing the Risen Lord. Other times, in our confusion or doubt Jesus remains hidden from our eyes.

The gift of resurrection life means that the most powerful obstacle to our union with God has been overcome. As St. Paul says, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God." Not even death itself. For the next fifty days we are entering a journey of discovery to see and to give witness to the presence of the Risen Lord among us.

Today, with God's help we are given the courage we need to roll back the stone that entombs us, that keeps us from becoming the person God meant us to be. To stay in the tomb of our unbelief is to deny our belief that God has the last word and that word is always LIFE!

As we journey in faith, it is important to remember that God has not come to rescue us from pain and suffering and death like some knight in shining armor; God has come to redeem us, to transform our lives, to make us new! This calls us to a deeper awareness of the importance of faith, hope and trust in God, to remain faithful especially when nothing makes sense.

Like the disciples we know how the story ends. The gift of resurrection life must strengthen us and enliven us to be people of hope. It's like a friend of mine who likes to read mystery novels. But, instead of reading the book from start to finish he reads the last chapter first to see what happens to the villain. Then he goes back and reads the book from the beginning always prepared to say to the villain, "Don't get too sure of yourself, I know that you will get what's coming to you in the end." Because of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead we all hold a different script in our hands. Sin and death do not have the last word. And so, on this Easter Sunday we lift our voices and say, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad, Alleluia!" (Psalm 118)

Children as Easter Observers. As the Easter season begins, challenge children to be "Easter Observers." Ask them to use all of their senses to observe, experience, and record as many signs of new life as possible as the Easter season begins—both at home or in their neighborhood. Encourage them to listen for the ringing of bells, the singing of "Alleluia," the sounds of birds, animals, and insects. They can see and smell the flowers that we use to decorate our parishes, homes, and gardens. They may find the gold and white colors of the priest's Easter vestments in their churches and outdoors. Baby animals may appear in the places the children visit. After giving children some time to be "Easter Observers," invite them to share at the dinner table some of the signs of Easter that they have spotted. (From: Sadlier Connect)

Blessing of Easter Meal (Share this prayer as a family when you gather for your Easter meal). "God of glory, the eyes of all turn to you as we celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death. Bless us and this food of our Easter meal. May we who gather at the Lord's table continue to celebrate the joy of his Resurrection and be admitted — finally to his heavenly banquet. What are you missing? The author Colleen Vermeulen invites us to ponder what you personally miss this year, without the usual public celebrations of Holy Week and Easter Sunday Mass. It could be a hymn, a favorite piece of art or decor in your parish sanctuary, a Psalm, a liturgical gesture like the passing of the "light of Christ" at the Vigil, the return of the Gloria, a particular Scripture reading or the gift of the Eucharist. Then, reflect again with the question: "How can I participate in the liturgical moment I know that I'll long for, in a new way this year?"

Maybe you'll illustrate text of a passage of Scripture, maybe you'll teach yourself to sing a favorite hymn, psalm, or prayer, maybe you'll start praying by candlelight or in darkness, or maybe you'll prayerfully incorporate a liturgical gesture into your own prayer time. Allow the Spirit to renew you through your longing, to form you in a new way, through what you'll know you'll truly miss during this exceptional Holy Week and Easter.

Lenten Pilgrimage: Hong Kong, China - Holy Spirit Study Center Maryknoll Missionaries in China hosted visiting seminarians to work with Catholic missionaries and learn about the culture and relationship between the people and the Church. Seminarians were introduced to the Diocese of Hong Kong's Holy Spirit Study Center. This research institute gathers, stores and analyzes pertinent data about China that serve to broaden understanding of the Mainland's changing situation and to effect appropriate Christian responses. The Center forges close relationships with Mainland Christians in both registered and unregistered Churches and assists Church related groups enroute to and from China. It is mindful of its responsibility to further the cause of reconciliation and unity within the China Church and to contribute to its on-going development.
