#### **PASTOR'S PEN**

The gospel reading for today and for next Sunday is taken from the 14th Chapter of John's Gospel. The scene is this, Jesus has gathered his disciples for the Passover meal, His Last Supper with the disciples. After washing their feet Jesus reveals some shocking news, Judas will soon betray him, Peter will deny him three times and finally He tells his disciples "My children, I will be with you only a little while longer." Talk about some depressing news! Then Jesus says, always remember my new commandment, "Love one another." When I am gone, this is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.

The disciples must have been overwhelmed with all that Jesus had said to them. Imagine the confusion, the hurt, the worry and fear that stirred in their hearts. Responding to their heavy hearts Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me." "I am preparing a dwelling place for you that is eternal." These words have served as a source of comfort and support for people throughout the centuries.

What does it mean for you to have a troubled heart? Maybe you would describe a troubled heart as being fearful, angry, stressed out, divided or frustrated with Covid-19. When the feelings of a troubled heart begin to stir within you Jesus says, "Follow me, for I am the way, the truth and the life." He offers this message of hope because we are chosen and precious in God's sight.

We are precious to God not because of anything we have done but because we are God's children. Through the waters of Baptism, we become children of God and temples of God's Spirit. Each of us is a unique reflection of God's love in the world just as a child reflects the identity of his or her parents. God loves each of us because He sees in each of us the love He has for His son, Jesus. The more that we can live in the awareness of our identity as children of God the more we will be at peace.

We might say Jesus is our GPS in life, "God's Presence through the Spirit." He is with us to show us the way to the Father. This is important because as St. Thomas A Kempis noted, "without the Way, there is no going. Without the Truth, there is no knowing. Without the Life, there is no living."

As we celebrate Mother's Day we are reminded that a parent's love for their child is so important because it mirrors for us the precious love that God has for each of us: a love that is unconditional, a love that is willing to make sacrifices for the good of the other and a love that is freely given even though we do not deserve it. Today as we honor our mothers, living and deceased, we also honor the Blessed Virgin Mary who with a mother's heart provides for the needs of her children, calms a troubled heart and teaches us the meaning of living faithful, hope-filled lives rooted in God's covenant of love.

Pope Francis reminds us, "We have a Mother, Mary. Cling to her as children cling to their mother, living in the hope that rests on Jesus. When Jesus ascended to heaven, he brought to the Heavenly Father our humanity, which he assumed in the womb of the Virgin Mary. Like an anchor, let us fix our hope on Christ. May this hope guide our lives, until our dying breath."

In this Easter season, we find joy and strength in the promise Jesus made that He will come back and take us to Himself, so that we can be with Him forever. Jesus instructs us to keep our eyes fixed on Him because He is the Way, the Truth and the Life." We don't need to guess which way to go or what path we are to take. We simply need to follow Him to that dwelling place He is preparing for us in heaven.

**Honoring Our Blessed Mother** On Sunday, May 10th Fr. Angelo and Fr. Matt will offer devotional prayers in honor of our Blessed Mother. You are invited to join us on the west parking lot at Emmanuel Church and remain in your car as we offer prayers at 12:00 noon.

### Mary, An Instrument in the Hand of God

Mary is given the title "Mother of God" in the Sub Tuum Praesidium which is the oldest known prayer to our Blessed Mother from around the year 250 AD. The prayer reads: "Under thy protection we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God".

Within the church, we refer to Mary as the Mother of God, because she carried within her womb the One who created her. As part of God's plan Mary allowed herself to be used as an instrument in God's hands. What does it mean to be an instrument of God? To dig into this analogy, it's helpful to think about a musical instrument. What happens if an instrument is never picked up and played? Nothing! It just sits there gathering dust. If the instrument is never practiced or used it easily gets out of tune or the valves begin to stick.

Scripture is full of stories that highlight various people who were open to becoming instruments in the hand of God. Throughout salvation history God uses human persons and human action to make His will and His love known in the world.

Recall the encounters leading up to the birth of Jesus. Through an angel, God told Mary how she would be a blessing for the world as the mother of Jesus. Elizabeth in her old age bears a son named John who would prepare the way of the Lord. Through a dream Joseph is instructed to take Mary into his home as his wife. The shepherds encountered the angels and share the message that had been told to them about the child Jesus. God is using many and varied instruments to bring his plan of salvation to light.

An important aspect of being an instrument in the hands of God is taking the time reflect or to ponder our life experiences. To reflect literally means to "bend back." The past is preparing us for the future and so, as the Blessed Virgin Mary reflects upon all these things that have gone on in her life she begins to see how she is part of a much bigger story, an instrument in the hands of God, our God who wants to reveal his love and mercy for us.

Today, as you are invited to be more attentive to the hand of God at work in your life, what are the lessons that you have learned from these experiences? What joys do you want to hold close to your heart to help you through these difficult times?

In this month of May as we honor our Blessed Mother. It is good for us to allow her grace, her openness, her readiness to be a servant of God to be our guide. Just as she participated in God's plan of salvation, we too are called to be an instrument in God's plan of salvation. What an awesome privilege we have been given! God has created us for this time and place and is counting on us to be willing instruments in His hands so that his love and mercy will be known to those who live in darkness and fear.

Lenten Pilgrimage: Mandalay, Myanmar - Small Income Generating Projects. Maryknoll missionary, Father Robert McCahill, has spent more than 25 years traveling throughout Bangladesh and Myanmar to create and help implement small income generating projects such as plantations, fish ponds and piggeries. These projects generate funds to support student boarding facilities. Each year, Father travels to Myanmar to visit a different diocese and work with local priests, sisters, brothers and lay leaders to identify 25 small projects to be financed by this project. Projects are expected to make a return on the investment within one year.
